No. 8/8 Notre Dame (0-2) vs. No. 16/17 Texas A&M (3-0)

TEAM NOTES

- ND won the toss and deferred to the second half. The Irish kicked off and defended the south endzone.
- Attendance 77,622 which marks the 14th consecutive sell out and 19 of the 21 home games coached by Marcus Freeman at Notre Dame
- Notre Dame falls to 4-3-0 all-time against Texas A&M and 1-1 at Notre Dame Stadium
- Notre Dame falls to 50-28-0 against SEC teams and 19-11-0 against the conference at home
- Notre Dame falls to 530-131-13 in Notre Dame Stadium
- Notre Dame falls to 110-21-04 all-time in home openers with a mark of 76-18-2 in Notre Dame Stadium
- Notre Dame's blocked punt is the first of the season, fourth since the start of the season and 11th for the program since the 2020 season.

NOTABLE

- Malachi Fields had a reception for the 29th consecutive game. He entered the weekend with the ninth-best streak of FBS players with consecutive games with at least one catch.
- Jordan Botelho made his 52nd career appearance in a Notre Dame uniform this evening tying him with Daelin Hayes (2016-20), Romeo Okwara (2012-15) and Drue Tranquill (2014-18) for 13th in program history.
- Tonight marked the 19th consecutive start at running back for Jeremiyah Love, matching Darius Walker (2004-06) for fifth all-time in program history for a running back.
- Jeremiyah Love accounted for 63 of the 75 yards during Notre Dame's fourth scoring drive of the game in the second quarter, including a 12-yard run and 36-yard touchdown reception.
- CJ Carr threw for a career-high 293 yards in his first career home start, the most in a home-first-start since Terry Hanratty (as a sophomore) threw for 304 yards and three touchdowns in a 26-16 win over Purdue on September 24, 1966.
