A WIN WOULD

- Return the Shillelagh Trophy to West Lafayette for the first time since the 2007 season
- Be Purdue's third win in Notre Dame since 1974
- Make Barry Odom the seventh Purdue head coach to beat Notre Dame in his debut, the first since Joe Tiller in 1997

THE OPENING KTCK

- After kicking off the Barry Odom era with three straight home games, Purdue Football hits the road for the first time under its new head coach. The Boilermakers make the 112-mile trip north to South Bend, Ind., to face No. 21 Notre Dame with the Shillelagh Trophy up for grabs. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. ET on NBC.
- - Purdue and Notre Dame are meeting for the 89th time in a series that started in 1896 with a 28-22 Boilermaker victory. The two programs have battled for the Shillelagh since 1957.
 - Throughout history, the Boilermakers are 4-2 on September 20. That includes a four-game winning streak on that date.
 - Nearly 75 years ago (Oct. 7, 1950), an unranked Purdue upset No. 1 Notre Dame 28-14 at Notre Dame Stadium. It was the first of four Purdue victories throughout history when the Fighting Irish were ranked No. 1 in the country, all between 1950-1967.
 - Notre Dame is one of six current Top 25 teams on Purdue's schedule this season. A year ago, the Boilermakers became the first team in history to face five College Football Playoff teams during the regular season.

- The Purdue defense has not given up a touchdown in the second half this season.
- Devin Mockobee is currently ranked in the program Top 10 in several career categories: 100-yard rushing games (4th), rushing yards (5th), rushing touchdowns (9th).
- Quarterback Ryan Browne ranks fourth in the Big Ten in passing, averaging 262.0 yards per game.
 Browne has eclipsed 300 yards passing in two of the three games this season.
- Browne's 14.04 yards per completion ranks 15th in the nation.
- Sophomore linebacker Charles Correa is one of two underclassmen in the country to have at least 20 tackles, 3.5 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks this season (MarcAnthony Parker - Navy).
- Three Boilermakers crack the nation's Top 25 in solo tackles. Tahj Ra-El ranks 18th with 16 solo tackles (5.3 per game), while Correa and Myles Slusher are tied for 23rd with 15 solo tackles (5.0 per game).
- Purdue is one of two teams (Kansas State) nationally to have three players with at least 15 solo tackles.
- EJ Horton Jr. and Michael Jackson III led the Boilermakers with 70 receiving yards apiece last week. It marked the first time since Purdue's victory in the 2023 Old Oaken Bucket Game that two Boilermakers recorded at least 70 receiving yards in the same game.
- face five College Football Playoff teams during the regular season.

 Jack McCallister is the first Purdue punter to average at least 50 yards per punt in a game (min. 3 punts) twice in a season since Jared Armstrong in 2006.

ABOUT THE SERIES

- Notre Dame and Purdue will meet for the 89th time overall and the 61st time in the Battle for the Shillelagh Trophy.
- The Irish hold a 60-26-2 advantage all-time, and have won the last nine contests.
- Purdue last beat Notre Dame on Sept. 29, 2007, winning 33-19 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- The rivalry series dates back to 1896, when Purdue beat the Irish in their first meeting, 28-22, in South Bend.
- Purdue is 19-41 games played for the Shillelagh Trophy since its introduction in 1957.
- The Boilers and Irish played every year from 1946 to 2014.

OUR LAST MEETING

#18 NOTRE DAME 66, PURDUE 7 SEPT. 14. 2024 - WEST LAFAYETTE, IND.

- Purdue fell to No. 18 Notre Dame, 66-7, at Ross-Ade Stadium after the Irish built a 42-0 halftime lead.
- Running back Reggie Love III paced the Boilermaker rushing attack with 10 carries for 61 yards, averaging 6.1 yards per touch against a stout Irish defense.
- Quarterback Hudson Card connected on 11-of-24 passes for 124 yards and a touchdown, highlighted by a 52-yard strike to Kam Brown in the third quarter.
- Two plays after the deep ball to Brown, Card found De'Nylon Morrissette for a five-yard touchdown, the sophomore's second score of the season and Purdue's lone points on the day.
- Tight end Max Klare led the team in receptions for the third straight week, hauling in three passes for 36 yards.
 On defense, safety Dillon Thieneman posted a team-high nine tackles (six solo) and added his first sack of the

BOILER NOTES

THE ODOM ERA BEGINS

- Guiding one of the greatest resurgences in college football over the past two seasons, Barry Odom was named the new head football coach of the Purdue Boilermakers on December 8, 2024.
- Odom, 48, became the 38th head coach in the history of Purdue Football, coming to West Lafayette following what could be considered the most impressive gridiron campaign in UNLV's school history. The Rebels reached double-digit wins for only the third time in program history (1974, 1984), with both previous seasons predating the program's move up to Division I competition and the Mountain West Conference, respectively.
- Prior to arriving at Purdue, Odom possessed a 44-33 overall record in six seasons as a head coach, four at Missouri (2016-19) and two at UNLV (2023-24). His 19-8 mark with the Rebels bears significance in that the five seasons prior to his arrival (2017-22), UNLV won just 20 games.
- Odom has a defensive background. A linebacker during his playing days at Missouri (1996-99), he has racked up seven seasons as a defensive coordinator over three stops: Memphis (2012-14), Missouri (2015) and Arkansas (2020-22).

BATTLE FOR THE SHILLELAGH TROPHY

- One of the most played matchups in Purdue Football history, Saturday's Shillelagh Trophy Game will be the 89th all-time meeting between the Boilermakers and Notre Dame.
- Purdue has only played four opponents more times than the Fighting Irish: Indiana (126), Illinois (100), Iowa (94) and Wisconsin (91).
- Purdue and Notre Dame have played for the Shillelagh since 1957. It was donated by Joe McLaughlin, a merchant seaman and a Fighting Irish fan who brought the club from Ireland.
- Purdue claimed three out of five games from Notre Dame from 2003-07, taking ownership of the Shillelagh Trophy in 2003, 2004 and 2007.

SUCCESS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Purdue has beaten seven ranked teams over the past seven seasons despite being the underdog in each one of those games.
- Three of those wins were against Top 3 teams, while Purdue handed five of those ranked teams their first loss of the season.
- The victories during the 2021 campaign (No. 2 Iowa, No. 3 Michigan State) gave Purdue multiple wins over Top 5 teams in one season for the first time since 1960 (No. 3 Ohio State, No. 1 Minnesota).
- · Five of the seven wins have been by double digits, the biggest being a 29-point victory over No. 2 Ohio State in 2018.
- Purdue has defeated a ranked Notre Dame team 16 times throughout history, including seven wins when the Fighting Irish cracked the Top 5 and four victories when Notre Dame was the No. 1 team in the country (1950, 1954, 1965, 1967).

LOCKDOWN DEFENSE

- After giving up some record-breaking numbers last year, the Purdue defense has locked down under new head coach Barry Odom and defensive coordinator Mike Scherer.
- The Boilermaker defense has not given up a touchdown in the second half this season. A 70-yard pick six by USC was the only touchdown scored by an opposing team after halftime.
- Purdue's defense has surrendered just nine second half points over the first three games.
- The Boilermakers shut out Ball State in the season opener, one of 10 teams to start the year with a shutout, allowing only 203 yards of total offense.
- In the final three quarters against SIU, Purdue only gave up three points and 130 yards, including just 66 yards in the second half.

FROM GEORGIA TO PURDUE

- In the offseason, the Purdue wide receiver room welcomed a pair of Georgia transfers who have become an important part of the Boilermaker offense.
- After making the move north, Michael Jackson III and Nitro Tuggle have combined for 21 catches for 372 yards and three touchdowns through the first three games of the season.
- Jackson leads the Boilermakers in receptions (14), while Tuggle's two receiving touchdowns are tied for a team best.
- Both receivers had their biggest games as Boilermakers in the B1G opener against USC. Jackson paced Purdue with seven receptions for 70 yards, and Tuggle added four catches for 69 yards and a touchdown, all season highs for the dynamic duo.

FAST START

- Purdue got off to fast starts in its first two games of the season. The Boilermakers scored touchdowns on their first two drives in both games, totaling 28 points. Purdue scored only 13 first quarter points Purdue throughout all of last season.
- Arhmad Branch scored Purdue's first touchdown in both games. The wide receiver has gotten off to fast starts of his own, recording five catches for 129 yards and two touchdowns in first quarters this year.
- It took the Boilermakers two plays and only 36 seconds to score for their first points of the season. After a 13-yard run by Devin Mockobee, Ryan Browne found Branch down the middle of the field. The sophomore wideout broke multiple tackles and added a smooth spin move before finding the end zone for the 49-yard touchdown.
- The last time Purdue scored within the first minute of the season was at the start of the 1981 campaign.

A BACK-TO-BACK START

- With the win over Southern Illinois, Barry Odom became the first Purdue head coach to start his tenure in West Lafayette 2-0 in more than a century.
- •The last coach to start his tenure 2-0 was Cleo O'Donnell in 1916 when he beat Monon Bell rivals Wabash and DePauw.
- The best start to a Purdue career was by Knowlton Ames, who went a perfect 12-0 over two seasons (4-0 in 1891, 8-0 in 1982) to win back-to-back Indiana Intercollegiate Athletic Association Championships.

- A schedule rarity, Purdue has three opponents from the state of Indiana this season.
- Purdue downed Ball State 31-0 to start the year.
- The Boilermakers will square off with Notre Dame for the Shillelagh Trophy on Sept 20.
- Purdue will close the regular season with the 100th Old Oaken Bucket Game against Indiana on Black Friday (Nov. 28)
- It marks the second straight season the Boilermakers will face three in-state foes and just the fifth time in the last 25 years.

BOILER NOTES

THE MOCKCAT OFFENSE

- In his first four years as a Boilermaker, Devin Mockobee never took a snap from the quarterback position. However, under new offensive coordinator Josh Henson, the Wildcat formation has become the Mockcat.
- All three of Mockobee's rushing touchdowns this season have come from the Purdue running back taking the snap before rumbling into the end zone.
- Scoring a pair of touchdowns in the win over Southern Illinois, Mockobee recorded his first game with multiple rushing touchdowns to bring his career total to 22 (ninth all-time).

HERE COMES THE MOCKTRAIN

- From walk-on to phenom, Devin Mockobee will finish his career as one of the best running backs in Purdue history.
- Mockobee has led the rushing attack for the Boilermakers in each of the last three seasons, amassing 2,696 yards on 563 carries with 22 touchdowns throughout his career with nine games over 100 yards rushing.
- He carried the ball 32 times for 126 yards and his first career multi-touchdown game against Southern Illinois.
- •The Boonville, Ind., native is the most experienced returner with 40 appearances and 26 starts at Purdue.
- •The senior was named to the Doak Walker Award, Wuerffel Trophy and AFCA Good Works Team Watch Lists, as well as the Senior Bowl Top 300 list.
- Mockobee did not entertain entering the transfer portal after last season, instead focusing on completing his mechanical engineering technology degree. His close connection to running backs coach Lamar Conard (2000 Purdue graduate), who was retained by Barry Odom, also was a major factor in staying at Purdue.
- He is one of 13 Big Ten running backs to rush for 650 yards in the last 10 years, a list that includes Saquon Barkley, Jonathan Taylor and Nicholas Singleton.
- Mockobee's impact can be felt beyond the field after donating \$10,000 to youth football in his hometown during the offseason.

WHAT CAN BROWNE DO FOR YOU

- Quarterback Ryan Browne has thrown for 786 yards on 56of-88 passing with five touchdowns.
- Browne currently ranks 15th nationally and third in the Big Ten with 14.04 yards per completion this season.
- Browne (15.0) joined Kyle Orton as the only two Purdue quarterbacks since 1995 to average 15.0 yards per completion through the first two games of the year (Kyle Orton 15.8 in 2004 and 15.0 in 2002).
- He is the eighth Purdue quarterback since 1995 to record a pair of 300-yard passing games over the opening three games of the season, joining the likes of Drew Brees (1999, 2000), Kyle Orton (2004), Curtis Painter (2007) and Aidan O'Connell (2022)
- Browne was named the starting quarterback by head coach Barry Odom in the last week of fall camp after a competition with Malachi Singleton, Bennett Meredith and Evans Chuba and Garyt Odom.
- Browne served as a backup for the Boilermakers last year, making one start, before spending the spring semester under Bill Belichick at North Carolina. He transferred back to Purdue during the spring portal window.

THAT'S A FACT JACK - FOR THE BRAND

- A starting punter for the past three seasons at Washington, senior Jack McCallister had no problem bringing his talents from the Pacific Northwest to West Lafayette.
- A weapon for the Boilermakers, McCallister's punts have forced opponents to a starting field position of their own 10.8-yard line.
- McCallister has punted six times on the year for an average of 52.3 yards per boot. He has dropped five ball inside the 20-yard line and launched four punts of 50 yards or more with a long of 68.
- Against USC, McCallister was called upon three times for an average of 54.3 yards per game, including a 68-yard boot.
- The 68-yard punt was the longest by a Boilermaker since Brooks Cormier's 69-yard punt against Minnesota in 2019.
- He is one of three Purdue punters to average 50+ yards on a minimum of three punts twice in a season since at least 1995 joining Jared Armstrong (2006) and Travis Dorsch (2000, 2001).
- In his Purdue debut, McCallister punted three times and averaged 50.3 yards per punt with all three landing inside the 20-yard line.
- He was named to the Ray Guy Award Ray's 8 after Week 1 and Week 3 of the season.

SEASON-OPENING SHUTOUT

- For the second straight season, Purdue began the year with a shutout victory. Jack Mollenkopf's Boilermakers in 1964 and 1965 were the last to record a season-opening shutout in consecutive seasons.
- The Boilermakers were one of 10 programs nationwide to start the season with a shutout, including one of only two Big Ten teams (Wisconsin).
- Purdue kept an FBS opponent off the scoreboard for the first time since a 49-0 victory over UConn in 2021.
- The Boilers limited Ball State to only 203 yards of total offense, which included just 87 passing yards. The defense also racked up seven tackles-for-loss and four sacks.
- Purdue was one of 21 teams over Week 0 and Week 1 to allow just one trip or less to the red zone.

MOCKING MOVING UP THE CHARTS

- Mockobee has already climbed into the top 10 at Purdue in several career categories: seventh in career rushing attempts (563), fifth in career yards (2,696), ninth in rushing touchdowns (22) and fourth in 100-yard rushing games (9).
- With a 59-yard day against Ball State, he became just the eighth Boilermaker in history to rack up 2,500 career rushing yards, moving up to seventh on the all-time charts in the process.
- His 126-yard outing against Southern Illinois saw him vault two spots up the rushing yards charts into the top five.
- The MockTrain is the ninth running back to lead Purdue in rushing for three straight seasons since 1946.
- He started his career by setting a new Purdue freshman record with 968 rushing yards while also adding nine touchdowns in 2022. After being put on scholarship, he led the team in rushing once again with 807 yards and six touchdowns in 2023. He posted 687 yards and four scores in 2024.

staff in the spring and throughout fall camp, it was evident that the sophomore was going to get more than one look in the season opener.

- Quarterback Ryan Browne targeted Branch early, posting three catches for 101 yards in the first guarter.
- Not only did Branch produce a 100-yard quarter, he became the first Purdue wide receiver to record a 100-yard game since Abdur-Rahmaan Yassen (Sept. 16, 2023 vs. Syracuse.
- Branch's first career catch was a 49-yard touchdown on the second play of the game for Purdue's first score of the season.
 On the second drive, he started off with a 17-yard snag before hauling in an impressive one-handed grab for 35 yards.
- Branch was one of only two wide receivers in the country to eclipse 100 yards on three-or-fewer receptions on the opening weekend, the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat since 2008.

SPECIAL SPENCER

- Kicker Spencer Porath has connected on all four of his field goal attempts this season with a long of 43 yards.
- The sophomore has made 11 kicks in his short career, already moving up to 20th on Purdue's career charts.
- He was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after going 2-for-2 on field goals against Southern Illinois.
- The last Boilermaker to earn Big Ten Special Teams of the Week was J.D. Dellinger in November of 2019.
- Last season, Porath connected on seven kicks to tie for fourth most on the Purdue freshmen charts.

NO PUNTS. NO PROBLEM

- In the 34-17 victory over Southern Illinois, the Purdue offense was so efficient that the Boilermakers did not have to punt during the game.
- It marked the first time Purdue played an entire game without punting since 2016, a 24-14 win over Nevada.
- The Boilermakers have had four games without a punt over the past 21 years, all games resulting in victories.
- Punting only six times this season, Purdue leads the nation in net punting with a 52.5 average. That includes ranking sixth in punt return defense, producing negative yardage (-0.5 average).

SLINGING IT AROUND IN THE SEASON OPENER

- Ryan Browne notched his first career win against Ball State behind a career-high 311 yards on 18-of-26 passing with a pair of touchdowns. He added another score on the ground.
- Browne was one of eight quarterbacks to throw for 300 yards against FBS opposition on the opening weekend of the season and was one of two to throw for 300 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while scoring another on the ground (Maverick McIvor Western Kentucky) against an FBS team.
- He joined Drew Brees (2000), Elijah Sindelar (2019), Jack Plummer (2021) and Aidan O'Connell (2022) as the only Purdue quarterbacks to register a 300-yard passing game in the season opener since 1995.
- He was the lone Big Ten quarterback to throw for 300 yards in Week 1 and led the league in total offense.

THE THRILLER

- Michael Jackson III was one of the stars of the wide receiver room throughout fall camp, and the new Boilermaker thrilled the Ross-Ade faithful in his first game at Purdue.
- Jackson caught a game-high six passes for 72 yards, matching his career high in receptions when he was a USC Trojan facing Notre Dame in 2023.
- He also hauled in his first touchdown as a Boilermaker, a 14-yard catch in the third quarter, before celebrating like the King of Pop, against the Cardinals.

HARD, SMART, TOUGH

• The three core principles of a Barry Odom-coached program are: hard, smart and tough. Playing football that way helped

- Odom's UNLV teams succeed in all three phases of the game each of the past two seasons.
- Odom's defenses have made 17 interceptions in both the 2023 season and the 2024 campaign. The 34 INTs were the second most recorded by a team over the past two years. The defenses also forced 49 turnovers during the two-year span, ranking fifth nationally.
- Odom's teams have put up points over the past two seasons, averaging 34.4 points per game in 2023 (22nd nationally) and 36.2 ppg in 2024 (14th nationally). The 953 total points throughout both 2023 and 2024 ranked sixth in the country.
- Odom emphasizes special teams, realizing it brings a winning edge to a program. In 2023, Odom's Rebels made 26-of-29 field goals for an 89.7 percent clip. Last season, his special teams unit blocked five punts to lead the nation.

ADDING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- It's a brand new era under head coach Barry Odom. With a coaching change, there always comes roster turnover. Odom welcomed at least 50 transfers in each of his two seasons at UNLV, attacking the portal to produce two of the best seasons in UNLV history.
- Heading into the 2025 campaign, Purdue has welcomed 54 transfers, which leads the nation. Add in high school signees and walk-ons, 82 Boilermakers are new to the program.
- Forty-six players practiced for the first day on the opening day of fall camp as post-spring practice additions.

ANOTHER SEASON OF PURDUE FOOTBALL

- The Boilermakers kicked off their 138th season of football in 2025 with a 31-0 win over Ball State.
- Ross-Ade Stadium has been Purdue's home for 101 seasons, marking the 2025 campaign as the 102nd full season.
- Purdue closed out the 1924 season with its first game at Ross-Ade, a 26-7 Homecoming win over Indiana (Nov. 22, 1924).
- The Boilermakers have held a team scoreless 182 times, resulting in 174 wins. The Boilermakers' most recent shutout was in the season opener against Ball State, 31-0. The largest shutout was a 96-0 win over Butler in 1893.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

- A season ago, Purdue faced the toughest schedule in college football history. Five Boilermaker opponents ended up making the College Football Playoff in 2024. No other team had as many playoff opponents on its schedule, and due to the CFP expanding to 12 teams last year, Purdue became the first team in history to face five playoff teams in one season.
- This season, the Boilermakers have another tough schedule that includes three CFP teams from 2024 (Notre Dame, Ohio State, Indiana) and five opponents ranked in the Preseason Top 25: No. 6 Notre Dame (Sept. 20), No. 12 Illinois (Oct. 4), No. 14 Michigan (Nov. 1), No. 3 Ohio State (Nov. 8), and No. 20 Indiana (Nov. 28).
- Purdue faces the past two national champions, Michigan and Ohio State, in back-to-back weeks to kick off the month of November.
- The 2025 slate was tabbed the 18th hardest in the nation by ESPN Football Power Index and 13th in Phil Steele's preseason guide.
- Purdue's trip to Washington for Game 11 will tie for the eighth-longest road trip in program history at 2,187 miles.

EXPERIENCE WELCOMED

Purdue's coaching staff was deliberate in finding players who could make an instant impact when signing players out

- of the transfer portal with 41 of the 54 additions bringing at least one game of experience in their career.
- Of the 41 players with collegiate experience, the group combined to average 23.9 games of experience throughout their career before arriving in West Lafayette. .
- Six new Boilermakers arrived in West Lafavette with 40 or more games played in their careers (Tony Grimes - 50. Christian Moore - 46, An"Darius Coffey - 45, Chauncey Magwood - 41, Jack McCallister - 41, Tahi Ra-El - 40), while nine other have 30 games of experience.
- Fifteen of Purdue's transfers started the final seven games at their previous stop.

THE CAPTAINS

- · At the end of fall camp, head coach Barry Odom announced the eight Boilermakers named captain for the 2025 campaign.
- Quarterback Ryan Browne, defensive backs An'Darius Coffey and Tony Grimes, wide receiver Michael Jackson III, running back Devin Mockobee, linebacker Mani Powell, defensive end CJ Madden and offensive lineman Jalen St. John were elected after a vote by the team.
- · Six of the selections are seniors in their final season, while Browne and Madden represent a young leadership group that hought into the new culture under Odom
- · Jackson III and Coffey made an quick impact in the locker room to earn their selection after joining Purdue following the conclusion of spring ball.

TRENT EARNS A SCHOLARSHIP

- Offensive lineman Ethan Trent came to West Lafayette with a family legacy already deeply entrenched in Purdue history. His older brother Tyler became a cult-hero for the Boilermaker faithful during the 2018 season. The Purdue superfan continued passionately cheering on his favorite team despite his hattle with a rare form of hone cancer
- Tyler's story was shared on ESPN College Gameday ahead of the Boilers' matchup against No. 3 Ohio State. In what became known as "The Tyler Trent Game," Purdue dominated the Buckeyes in a 49-20 upset rout in Ross-Ade. Ethan, who appeared multiple times in the Gameday piece, was the one pushing Tyler's wheelchair as the pair stormed the field along with thousands of other fans.
- In 2023, Ethan joined the football team as a preferred walkon freshman, Last season, he made his Boilermaker debut and appeared in three games.
- Impressing head coach Barry Odom with his hard work and quickly becoming a major piece to the Purdue offensive line, Ethan earned a scholarship during the spring.
- He earned his first career start for against Ball State.

BROWNE OFF THE BENCH IN 2024

- Ryan Browne appeared in eight games last season, making two starts, throwing for 532 yards and four touchdowns with a QB efficiency of 127.5. He rushed for 241 yards on 50 carries.
- Making his first career start in place of an injured Hudson Card, Ryan Browne rose to the occasion and nearly led Purdue to the biggest comeback in program history at No. 23 Illinois (Oct. 12, 2024).
- The Clarkston, Michigan, native became just the sixth Boilermaker quarterback to eclipse 100 yards rushing in a game, joining Phipps, Bob Bobrowski, Gary Danielson, Rob Henry and Kirsch. His 118 rushing yards were the most by a Purdue quarterback since Henry at 132 at Northwestern on Not 9 2010
- Browne's day on the ground eclipsed his 85-yard day he had in relief against Northwestern a season ago, but he joined Drew Brees as the only Purdue quarterbacks (since 1996) to produce a pair of 80-yard rushing games.
- For his performance against the Illini, Browne earned a 90.9 grade from PFF, the best by a Purdue QB on the road since at least 2008.

NFL QB U

- The home of the Cradle of Quarterbacks, Purdue has sent an impressive army of gunslingers to the NFL. Two of the four Boilermakers enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame are quarterbacks Len Dawson and Bob Griese. (Hank Stram & Rod Woodson)
- Entering the 2025 season, Purdue alumni have combined to throw for 262.241 yards and 1.762 touchdowns.
- Drew Brees, who is in his first year of eligibility for the Pro Football Hall of Fame, was Purdue's all-time passing leader in the NFL and ranks second in league history with 80,358 passing yards and 571 touchdowns.
- Jim Everett, Len Dawson, Jeff George and Bob Griese all threw for more than 20,000 yards during their professional careers.
- Purdue quarterbacks have combined to win four Super Bowls, tied for fourth most by a school - Len Dawson SBIV, Bob Griese SB VII & VIII and Drew Brees SBXLIV.
- It is one of two schools to have three different Super Bowl champion quarterbacks, second only to Alabama's four.

FIRST GAME OF A NEW ERA

- · Barry Odom became the 19th head coach in Purdue history to win his first game in charge at Purdue, when the Boilermakers downed Ball State 31-0 on Aug. 30.
- The last coach prior to Odom to lead Purdue to victory in his debut was Danny Home in 2009 against Toledo.
- Jim Colletto is the only other head coach to win in his debut in the last 50 years, knocking off Eastern Michigan in 1991.

25TH ANNIVERSARY FOR THE BIG TEN CHAMPS

- •The 2025 season marks the 25th anniversary of the Boilermakers' 200Big Ten title and trip to the 2001 Rose Bowl Game. Purdue welcomed back the historic team to Ross-Ade Stadium for the USC game on Sept. 13.
- Quarterbacked by Heisman Trophy finalist and Maxwell Award winner Drew Brees, the Boilermakers went 8-4 overall with a 6-2 mark in Big Ten play to earn a share of the Big Ten title and reach the Rose Bowl Game for the first time since 1967.
- Ten Boilermakers garnered All-Big Ten honors, led by Brees, the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and Chicago Tribune Silver Football Award winner. Safety Stuart Schweigert was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- The 2000 roster featured seven future Super Bowl champions (Drew Brees, John Standeford, Matt Light, Gene Mruczkowski, Chukky Okobi, Brandon Gorin, Gilbert Gardner).

WATCH LIST SEASON

- A pair of Boilermakers were recognized during watch list season this summer.
- Transfer linebacker Mani Powell was named to the Butkus Award Watch List, as one of the 51 best linebackers in the nation and one of 12 from the Big Ten.
- Running back Devin Mockobee was honored for his play on the field on the Senior Bowl Top 300 List and the Doak Walker Award Watch List.
- Mockobee was also recognized for the AFCA Good Works Team and Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, following a \$10,000 contribution to youth football in his hometown.

247SPORTS 30UNDER30

- General Manager Brandon Lee and defensive ends coach Jake Trump were tabbed to the 247Sports 2025 30Under30 list in mid-August.
- Purdue is one of two programs to have multiple staff members on the list (Illinois).
- Trump joined Odom in West Lafayette after spending the past five seasons at Arkansas. Three of those years were when Odom was the Razorbacks' defensive coordinator. While in Fayetteville, Trump helped mentor 12 All-SEC defenders.
- While only in his first season as the Boilermakers' general manager, Lee has been a rising star in college athletics for some time. The Indianapolis native arrived at Purdue after serving as associate athletic director for student-athlete brand strategy and innovation at Mississippi State.
- Prior to reuniting at Purdue and embarking on their respective careers, Lee and Trump were teammates at Missouri (2015-18) under Odom's guidance.

MBOW TO THE GIANTS IN THE 5TH ROUND

- Marcus Mbow was selected in the fifth round of the 2025 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, reuniting him with Purdue teammate, running back Tyrone Tracy Jr.
- Mbow started all 12 games at right tackle in 2024, recording a 75.2 run blocking grade by PFF, ranking sixth among Big Ten tackles.
- Mbow played in 36 games throughout his Purdue career, making 32 starts between right guard and right tackle. He was All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in each of the past three seasons.
- Dating back to the beginning of the Joe Tiller era (1997), at least one Boilermaker has been chosen in every NFL Draft aside from the 2019 season.

DB DEPTH

- Perhaps the most overhauled position on the 2025 roster was the defensive backs room with 12 new additions since head coach Barry Odom arrived in West Lafayette.
- 10 of the 12 have previous experience with the entire room boasting 331 games of collegiate experience. The average experience level of the college additions was 27.6 games played in a career.
- Senior Tony Grimes was named a captain ahead of the season, following time spent at UNLY, Texas A&M and North Carolina.
- An'Darius Coffey, another elected captain, Tahj Ra-El and Chalil Cummings all arrived with defensive backs coach Charles Clark from Memphis.
- Eight defensive backs have appeared in 27 games or more throughout their career, while seven have started double-figure games.

BOILERMAKER BACKERS

- Defensive Coordinator and linebackers coach Mike Scherer followed head coach Barry Odom from UNLV, where he held the same role in two seasons with the Rebels. Scherer was a standout linebacker at Missouri under Odom.
- Following Scherer from UNLV, Mani Powell found success in the system last season, totaling 59 tackles, 9.0 tackles-forloss and 3.5 sacks. Powell received preseason buzz with his addition to the Butkus Award Watch List.
- Joining the UNLV crew in West Lafayette, Charles Correa appeared in 14 games for the Rebels with two starts as a true freshman last season. Correa credits Odom and Scherer's leadership and family atmosphere for his reasoning to follow the duo to Purdue.
- Sanders Ellis joined Purdue from Tennessee State in the FCS ranks, where he was a Freshman All-American and finished fifth in the Jerry Rice Award voting. A versatile linebacker for the Tigers, Ellis finished second among FCS freshmen in tackles-for-loss (15.5) and third in total tackles (86) in 2024.
- Alex Sanford Jr. looks to carve out a significant role on the Boilermakers' defense after two seasons at Arkansas. He was recruited by Odom and Scherer at Arkansas.

THE TIGHT ENDS

- Offensive coordinator Josh Henson will also have tight ends responsibility tied to his title in 2025. He earned his college football coaching breakthrough serving as the tight ends coach at Oklahoma State (2001-04) and LSU (2005-08).
- The group carries a large frame as a unit, averaging a height of six feet-5.6 inches, good to tie for second tallest in the Big Ten behind Maryland's six feet-5.8 inches.
- Christian Earls carries the largest frame (6-foot-8, 280 pounds), and followed Odom from UNLV after 20 appearances in the last two seasons.
- George Burhenn looks to lead the group this season. He finished his 2023 campaign with five catches for 74 yards and a 33-yard touchdown in the finale vs. Indiana and showed promise before an injury-plagued 2024 campaign limited him to four games. His name pronunciation in the guide (a cold chicken), Burhenn fed into the nickname enough to get a tattoo of a cold chicken.
- Christian Moore brings a hybrid style between fullback and tight end across his 46 games between UNLV (2024) and Kansas State (2020-23). He finished fifth among FBS tight ends with a 79.9 run blocking grade last year.
- Rico Walker, a former four-star prospect, appeared in 13 games over two seasons at Maryland and Auburn.

IN THE TRENCHES

- Purdue's offensive line has made monumental strides during the offseason under coach Vance Vice. While most position groups will be dominated by newcomers out of the portal, a trio of returners last year will look to make their impact in the starting five.
- Bakyne Coly and Joey Tanona were both understudies last year, making the occasional rotation into the playing group.
 Tanona is a former four-star prospect who left Notre Dame after a car accident before his first practice barred him from playing for the Fighting Irish, while Coly has packed on 30-plus pounds since his arrival in West Lafayette three years ago.
- Jalen St. John is has the most experience of any linemen, having played 39 games over his five years in college.
- Ethan Trent worked his tail off during the offseason to not only earn a scholarship, but to a serious contender for Purdue's starting group.

HONORING GARY DANIELSON

- A familiar face returned to West Lafayette for the game against USC in legendary quarterback Gary Danielson.
- A longtime college football analyst for CBS, Danielson called the Boilermakers and the Trojans in his 36th and final year in the broadcast booth.
- Danielson (1970-72) is one of 12 QBs that make up Purdue's Cradle of Quarterbacks.
- He was honored at halftime in front of a packed Ross-Ade Stadium and presented with a framed jersey with his No. 18 by fellow Cradle members Drew Brees and Mark Herrmann.
- In 1971, Danielson led the Big Ten in passing offense with 1,467 yards and was the architect of six of the conference's 11 longest plays of the season. He set the Big Ten record for passing accuracy that year at 61.7 percent in conference games.
- In the early 1970s, Purdue Athletics commissioned a university artist named Keith Butz to create a poster featuring outstanding Boilermaker quarterbacks of the previous 30 years. That poster featured Bob DeMoss, Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bernie Allen, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson.

SPECIAL TEAMS. SPECIAL PLAYERS

- James Shibest, who Odom calls "the best special teams coach in the country," joins Purdue after a two-year stint under Odom at UNLV and is a 25-year coaching veteran.
 His unit in 2024 led the nation with five blocked punts and finished third with five blocked kicks. In each of his two seasons at UNLV, he mentored a kicker, kick returner and punt returner to All-Mountain West honors.
- Jack McCallister's addition at punter during the summer brought 41 games of collegiate experience at Washington. His experience includes punting in the 2023 CFP National Championship vs. No. 1 Michigan. McCallister has a 42-yard average with 33 punts pinned inside the 20.
- Spencer Porath is Purdue's only special teams returner this season after he appeared in nine games as a true freshman in 2024. He went 7-of-11 (63.9%) on field goal attempts.
- The Boilermakers brought in Seth Turner to compete with Porath for the kicking job in 2025. While he did not receive any game experience in two seasons at UConn, Turner did nail a 56-yard field goal during fall camp to enhance the competition.
- Purdue's return game remains a competition, but Shibest noted that Michael Jackson III stood out throughout fall camp at both kick and punt returner.

-HEAD COACH BARRY ODOM

Guiding one of the greatest resurgences in college football over the past two seasons, Barry Odom was named the new head football coach of the Purdue Boilermakers on December 8, 2024.

Odom, 48, became the 38th head coach in the history of Purdue Football, coming to West Lafayette following what could be considered the most impressive gridiron campaign in UNLV's school history. The Rebels reached double-digit wins for only the third time in program history (1974, 1984), with both previous seasons predating the program's move up to Division I competition and the Mountain West Conference, respectively. National recognition has followed, as the Rebels have achieved a program-best No. 19 ranking in both the AP and Coaches polls, as well as their first-ever CFP ranking.

Fresh off steering UNLV Football to its winningest season in 40 years, Odom has compiled an impressive list of accomplishments throughout his coaching career, which includes stints as a head coach in both the Southeastern Conference with Missouri (2016-19) and the Mountain West Conference with the Rebels (2023-24). UNLV has totaled 19 wins during Odom's time guiding the Rebels, making it the winningest two-year stretch in the school's history as a Division I program. As a head coach, he has secured four postseason appearances in six seasons, including two (2017 Texas Bowl, 2018 Liberty Bowl) bowl bids at Missouri.

His 19-8 mark with the Rebels bears significance in that the five seasons prior to his arrival (2017-22), UNLV won just 20 games. Impressively, his UNLV teams posted a 10-2 mark in true road games after the program only won eight total road games in the previous six seasons (8-25).

In just two seasons, Odom dramatically changed expectations in Las Vegas, with UNLV twice advancing to the MWC Championship Game after the program had not made a single appearance in the event prior to his arrival. Following Odom's first campaign in Las Vegas (9-5, 6-2 MWC), he was named the 2023 Mountain West Coach of the Year. He also earned distinction as the program's first-ever Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award finalist. The 2023 season culminated in an appearance in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl in Phoenix, Arizona.

Odom's adept tutelage saw three Rebels earn All-America status, and the program christened its first-ever First Team Academic All-American after the 2023 season. Back-to-back seasons of six First Team All-MWC honorees for the Rebels have occurred, including a school-record 12 combined recognitions between the conference's first and second teams in 2024. Incoming Rebels have seen a boost in notoriety, as well, with Odom's 2025 signees ranking as the top class in the Mountain West.

Odom has also spent impactful tenures as a highly regarded defensive coordinator at Memphis (2012-14), Missouri (2015) and Arkansas (2020-22). For the Razorbacks, Odom served as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and safeties coach. His 2021 defense turned heads, as it allowed just 22.9 points per game – 12 points fewer per game than in 2020 and the fewest for an Arkansas defense since 2014. Focusing on the run defense, the unit evolved to allow just 153.9 yards per game, the fewest for Arkansas since 2015. Under Odom's watch, Arkansas' 18 takeaways during the 2020 campaign ranked 25th nationally. The Razorbacks' 13 interceptions were second most in the SEC and 13th most in the FBS.

During his first defensive coordinator job at Memphis in 2012, he transformed the Tigers into a defensive power. In 2014, his defense ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 points per game) and 22nd nationally in total defense (343.3 yards per game) to help the Tigers go 10-3. That marked an incredible turnaround for a Memphis team that ranked 117th in total defense prior to his arrival. The program improved defensively each year under Odom, rising from 50th nationally in total defense in 2012 to 39th in 2013 to 22nd in his final year.

Before moving to Fayetteville, Odom spent four seasons as Missouri's head coach, taking two of his teams to bowl games and finishing at .500 or better three times en route to building an overall record of 25-25 from 2016-19. His 2018 Missouri squad finished the regular season ranked 23rd in the College Football Playoff poll.

Regarded among the coaching fraternity for his steadfast pathway to the top, Odom was promoted to the head coaching role at Missouri following the retirement of Gary Pinkel, whom he worked for in numerous capacities while on staff at Missouri in two separate stints. From 2003-2011, Odom served as graduate assistant, director of recruiting, director of football operations and safeties coach for the Tigers. Upon returning from his three seasons at Memphis, Odom served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2015 before his promotion ahead of the 2016 season.

Odom was born in Lawton, Oklahoma, and raised in Maysville, Oklahoma. He was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker for Missouri from 1996-99, helping the school make two bowl trips and serving as team captain during his senior season. He ended his MU career ranked in the program's all-time top 10 with 362 tackles

Odom graduated from Missouri in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in education and earned his master's in education from the school in 2004. He and his wife, Tia, have two sons, JT and Garyt, and a daughter, Anna.





ROSS-ADE STADIUM HISTORY

- Ross-Ade Stadium was dedicated Nov. 22, 1924, ahead of its first game when Purdue hosted Indiana. The Boilermakers demolished their in-state foes in a 26-7 rout.
- The two men for whom the stadium is named after, David E. Ross and George Ade, were instrumental in building a stadium that has served as the backdrop to Purdue lore over the last 101 seasons. Ross conceived of the idea for a new stadium to replace Stuart Field, a 5,000-seat stadium that hosted Purdue Football from 1892 to 1924 and was located where the Elliot Hall of Music stands today.
- The original capacity for Ross-Ade Stadium in 1924 was 18,500, including standing room tickets. Over the years and several renovations, the capacity grew to its largest at 69.200 in 1970.
- The largest crowd ever to see a game at Ross-Ade is 71,629 against Indiana on Nov. 22, 1980, when Purdue outlasted the Hoosiers, 24-23, on the shoulders of consensus All-Americans quarterback (and current John Purdue Club Director of Leadership and Alumni Engagement) Mark Hermann and tight end Dave Young.
- · Additional upgrades to the stadium included a new press box, luxury boxes and premium club areas in 2003 as a part of a \$70 million project. Permanent lighting was installed in 2017 and a new sound system in 2018.
- The Tyler Trent (T2) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of Purdue superfan Tyler Trent who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma. The T² Gate was relocated to the south side of the stadium after the 2023 student section renovations were completed.

The 2023 season saw the completion of the Phase I of a multi-phased renovation project at a cost of more \$45 million, fully funded by gifts to the John Purdue Club.

The three main enhancements to the stadium were the Tiller Tunnel, the south end zone student section and the team dining facility, which opened in July of 2024, on the north side of the stadium, bringing the total capacity up to 61,441

SOUTH END ZONE PROJECT

The Purdue student section and the All-American Marching Band have a new home in the south end zone of Ross-Ade. Stadium. As a part of the Phase I project, the dedicated student section enhancements included the addition of a new Tyler Trent student entrance area, safe standing seats, patio and deck areas, rail seating, and enhanced concessions.

The completion of the bowl, in addition to the investment in the size of the concourse, allows for a more accessible fan experience as fans will now be able to traverse the entire stadium at the concourse level.

TILLER TUNNEL

The Boilermakers run onto Rohrman Field at Ross-Ade Stadium via the Tiller Tunnel. Completed in 2023, the tunnel provides direct access to the team back to the Kozuch Football Performance Center

The tunnel is named in honor of the Purdue Hall of Fame inductee Joe Tiller, the winningest coach in the history of Purdue Football. Tiller left an incredible legacy on the program and Boilermakers everywhere. The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, and a Big Ten Conference championship in 2000.

THE MEMORIAL TUNNEL

Purdue was slated for face in-state foe Indiana in 1903 at a neutral site for the first time at Washington Park in Indianapolis.

Purdue reserved two special charter trains in order to carry the football team and over 1,500 supporters to the state

Around 10 a.m. on Oct. 31, 1903, the lead special charter train carrying the team, members of the band and other university administrators collided with a northbound coal train. Seventeen people were killed, including 14 members of the football team.

Purdue dedicated the southeast tunnel of Ross-Ade Stadium to the victims of the tragedy in 2003 to mark the centennial of the wreck. Memorial Gymniasium, now Felix Haas Hall housing the Department of Computer Science, was dedicated to the victims in 1909. It has 17 steps at the entrance, one for each victim.

DEN OF DEFENSIVE ENDS

Throughout its history, Purdue has produced many outstanding defensive ends, creating an institution unlike any other in college football - The Den of Defensive Ends.

The tradition of The Den of Defensive Ends dates to the days of Leo Sugar and Lamar Lundy from the late 1940s to the mid-1950s and Keena Turner in the late 1970s, but it has flourished more recently. While Purdue's high-powered offense has made headlines under head coaches like Joe Tiller and Jeff Brohm, the Boilermakers' defense made a name for itself principally for the play of its ends.

Purdue opened the season with a resounding 31-0 win over Ball State.

Ryan Browne completed 69.2% of his passes with no turnovers. He finished 18-of-26 passing for a career-high 311 yards and two touchdowns, connecting with seven receivers.

Devin Mockobee paced the offense with 104 all-purpose yards (59 rushing, 45 receiving) and a touchdown. He moved from ninth to seventh place on Purdue's all-time rushing list (2,521 career rushing yards) and is now 73 yards away from tying Markell Jones for the No. 6 spot.

Mockobee became the 10th Boilermaker to score 20 rushing touchdowns.

Arhmad Branch led the aerial attack with a touchdown and 101 receiving yards, the most by a Purdue wide receiver since Abdur-Rahmaan Yaseen had 114 against Syracuse on Sept. 16, 2023. He scored on just the second play from scrimmage on a 49-yard dime from Browne, setting the tone early.

Michael Jackson III had a game-high six catches, matching his career best in his Purdue debut. He caught a 14-yard pass from Browne to score his first touchdown as a Boiler in the third quarter.

The defense held the Cardinals to 203 total yards and just 87 yards through the air. BSU averaged just 3.9 yards per play.

Tahj Ra-El led the team with seven tackles (all solos), including one for a loss. The Boilers made life difficult for the Cardinals all day, stuffing them behind the line for seven tackles for loss, including four sacks.

Jack McCallister had three punts for 151 yards, an average of 50.3 per punt, all landing within the Ball State 20-yard line.

Purdue improved to 2-0 with a 34-17 victory over SIU, giving head coach Barry Odom the program's best start in a Purdue coach's first year since 1916.

Ryan Browne directed a balanced attack, completing 14-of-23 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns. The sophomore also added 50 yards rushing, helping Purdue score on six of its eight drives without a punt.

Devin Mockobee carried the load on the ground with 32 attempts for 126 yards and two touchdowns, his first career game with multiple rushing scores. The senior climbed to fifth on Purdue's all-time rushing list (2,651 yards) while notching his ninth career 100-yard game.

Tight end George Burhenn paced the receiving corps with three catches for 48 yards. Arhmad Branch opened Purdue's scoring on a 13-yard touchdown grab, while Georgia transfer Nitro Tuggle hauled in his first career touchdown on a 29-yard strike from Browne late in the first quarter.

The Boilermaker defense rebounded after allowing two early touchdowns, limiting the Salukis to just three points over the final three quarters. Purdue held SIU to 81 rushing yards on 26 carries, an average of 3.1 yards per attempt.

CJ Nunnally IV made back-to-back sacks in the 4Q, his first multi-sack game in a Purdue uniform. Charles Correa made a big play in the first half, tallying his first career sack on third down to force the Salukis' initial punt.

Tahj Ra-El led the team again with seven solo tackles. The Boilers finished with three sacks and seven tackles for loss on the night.

Kicker Spencer Porath remained perfect on the season, drilling field goals from 28 and 43 yards. He's now 3-for-3.

After a three-hour weather delay, Purdue dropped its BIG opener 33-17 to USC.

Ryan Browne continued to shine, throwing for 305 yards and two touchdowns. He opened the second half with a highlight-reel play, scooping up a tipped backward pass on a trick play and racing 34 yards for a score. Later in the third quarter, he found Nitro Tuggle for a nine-yard touchdown, marking the Georgia transfer's second consecutive game with a touchdown.

Tuggle and EJ Horton Jr. led Purdue receivers with 70 yards each, while senior running back Devin Mockobee added 45 yards on the ground.

Despite producing 365 yards of total offense, the Boilermakers were undone by three interceptions in USC territory. The Trojans countered with 460 yards, led by quarterback Jayden Maiava, who threw for 282 yards and added a rushing touchdown.

On defense, Myles Slusher posted a career-high 12 tackles, while Charles Correa set his own mark with 11. Demeco Kennedy chipped in his first career sack, bringing down Maiava for a nine-yard loss in the second quarter.

Special teams provided bright spots once again. Kicker Spencer Porath stayed perfect on the season, drilling a 39-yard field goal in the second quarter. Jack McCallister closed the night with a career-long 68-yard punt, averaging 54.3 yards on three attempts. He became the first Purdue punter since 2006 to average at least 50 yards per punt in multiple games during a season.

The Boilermakers fell to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in Big Ten play, while USC improved to 3-0 and 1-0 in the league.
