TEAM NOTES

- Notre Dame captains WR Will Pauling, S Adon Shuler, DT Donovan Hinish and OL Aamil Wagner represented the Irish for the coin toss.
- Stanford won the toss and elected to defer. Notre Dame received and defended the southeast endzone.
- Attendance - 27,456
- Notre Dame is now 25-14-0 all-time against Stanford
- The Irish improve to 10-9 all-time in true road games against the Cardinal
- Head coach Marcus Freeman is now 3-1 against Stanford
- Notre Dame improves to 225-84-3 all-time against current ACC members with a 93-42-3 record in away games
- The Irish are now 17-2 against ACC opponents under head coach Marcus Freeman (excludes 2022 contests against Cal and Stanford and 2023 game against Stanford as both teams were active Pac-12 members)
- Notre Dame improves to 8-2 against ACC foes in true road games under Freeman
- The two teams play for the Legends Trophy, which is a combination of Irish crystal and California redwood. The trophy was presented for the first time in 1989 by the Notre Dame Club of the San Francisco area.
- Today's kickoff time was 10:40 p.m. ET. The last time Notre Dame kicked off this late was in 1991 - at Stanford and at Hawaii - both games kicked at 11 p.m. ET.

NOTABLE

- RB Jeremiyah Love started his 29th consecutive game this afternoon, which is the second-longest streak by a running back in program history. Allen Pinkett (1982-85) holds the school record in that category with 35 straight starts.
- On his two-yard rushing touchdown on the opening drive. RB Jeremiyah Love set the single-season program record for total touchdowns with his 21st, surpassing Jerome Bettis (1991). The rushing touchdown was also Love's 18th of the season on the ground, tying Audric Esteime (2023) for most in a single-season in Notre Dame history.
- It's the 15th time in their careers that both RB Jeremiyah Love and RB Jadarian Price have scored a touchdown in the same game. Notre Dame is 14-1 when both Love and Price find the endzone in the same game.

- QB CJ Carr threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to RB Jadarian Price with 23 seconds left in the second quarter to put the Irish up 35-3. It's the 12th-straight game with a touchdown pass for Carr, which is the longest streak by a Notre Dame quarterback since Everett Golson from 1/7/2023 - 1/22/2014.
- With his two passing touchdowns tonight, QB CJ Carr finished the regular season with 24 touchdown strikes, tying Sam Hartman and DeShone Kizer for the most passing touchdowns in their first 12 career Notre Dame starts since 1966.
- With his 10-yard reception on the first play from scrimmage, WR Malachi Fields now has a reception in 39 consecutive games. He entered the weekend tied with the fourth-longest streak of FBS players with consecutive games with at least one catch.
- CB Leonard Moore recorded his fifth interception of the season in the second quarter and the 21st of the season for the Irish defense, which came into the game leading the nation in interceptions.
- DL Jordan Botelho made his 62nd career appearance in a Notre Dame uniform this afternoon, which puts him tied for third on the program's all-time list for game appearances with Houston Griffith (2018-22) and Rylie Mills (2019-24).
- DL Junior Tuihalamaka made his 54th career appearance in a Notre Dame uniform this evening, which puts him 13th on the program's all-time list for game appearances.
- In the second quarter, DL Joshuna Burnham tossed an 84-yard touchdown to S Luke Talich on a fake punt. Burnham is the first Notre Dame defensive lineman since at least 1955 to throw a passing touchdown.
- S Luke Talich's 84-yard touchdown reception in the first half is the longest reception by a defensive player for the Irish, from scrimmage, since 1955. Dave Waymer, who played much of his career at safety for the Irish, was playing wide receiver for Notre Dame in 1977 and scored on a 68-yard reception from Joe Montana in a 69-14 victory over Georgia Tech.
