TEAM NOTES

- Notre Dame captains OL Aamil Wagner, DL Donovan Hinish, S Adon Shuler and WR Will Pauling represented the Irish for the coin toss.
- Boston College won the toss and elected to defer. Boston College kicked off and Notre Dame defended the south endzone.
- Attendance - capacity crowd of 44,500
- Notre Dame improves to 19-9-0 against Boston College and 7-4-0 in true road games at BC.
- Marcus Freeman improves to 2-0 against Boston College, 14-2 against ACC teams and 6-2 in true ACC road games. .
- Notre Dame extends its winning streak over Boston College to 10 games, the longest in the history of the series.
- Notre Dame improves to 222-84-3 all-time against ACC opponents and 91-42-3 in road games.
- Notre Dame is 221-84-3 all-time against ACC opponents and 90-42-3 in road games
- Notre Dame retains possession of the Frank Leahy Memorial Trophy, which dates back to 1975 to commemorate the winner of the Notre Dame - Boston College game.
- The 40-yard touchdown throw to Malachi Fields followed by the 44-yard strike to Will Pauling in the first half marks the second time this season CJ Carr has connected with his receivers for 40-yard scoring throws. Carr found Fields (66 yards) and Jordan Faison (48) against Purdue on September 20.
- Notre Dame has intercepted at least two passes in each of the last four games, the best streak for the Irish since the 1995 team intercepted two passes in each game over a five-game stretch from Oct. 21 through Jan. 1. The 12 passes intercepted by the Irish defense over the last four games are the most for the program over four games since 1977, when the team also intercepted 12 in four games from Oct. 15 through Nov. 5. That '77 team intercepted 13 passes over a four-game streak as well.

NOTABLE

- With his 94-yard run in the fourth quarter, coupled with his 98-yard run in the CFP First Round Victory over Indiana last season, Jeremiyah Love became the first Notre Dame player with two 90-yard rushing plays in a career.
- WR Malachi Fields' 40-yard touchdown reception on the first play of the second quarter gives him at least one reception in 35 consecutive games. He entered the weekend tied with the eighth-best streak of FBS players with consecutive games with at least one catch.

- RB Jeremiyah Love started his 25th consecutive game this afternoon, matching Mark Green (1985-88) for second on Notre Dame's list for consecutive running back starts. Allen Pinkett (1982-85) holds the school record in that category with 35 straight starts.
- Love's three-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter, followed by his 94 yard run, is the 34th and 35th touchdowns of his career, matching Vegas Ferguson (1976-79) for sixth in overall touchdowns in Notre Dame history. His 29 rushing touchdowns rank him seventh all-time with Audric Estimé (2021-23) and Neil Worden (1951-53).
- DL Jordan Botelho made his 58th career appearance in a Notre Dame uniform this afternoon, the eight-most in the history of the program.
- LB Drayk Bowen piled up a career-high 14 tackles in today's game. His LB running back Kyngtsonn Viliamu-Asa had a career-best nine tackles in the game.
- S Tae Johnson intercepted a career-best two passes today.
