Irish Take Battle Against Knights

Notre Dame opened its 2025-26 campaign on Wednesday with a dominant 98-52 victory over FDU. The Irish were firing on all cylinders from deep, going 9-17 on the night (52.9 percent), the program's best 3FG% in an opener since 2016 against Central Michigan (12-22, 54.5 percent). It was also Notre Dame's largest margin of victory in an opener since 2017 versus Mount St. Mary's, 121-65.

Individually, Hidalgo led the way with 27 points, and two newcomers showed they are ready to shock college basketball this year. Duke transfer de Jesus posted a career-high 22 points and went 4-6 from deep.

"Vanessa is a great player and a great leader," Hidalgo said postgame. "Playing alongside her, us in the backcourt, I think is going to be dangerous. She's such a smart player."

Kansas State transfer Gisela Sanchez recorded her first career double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds. The 6-4 forward showed off her versatilty, going 6-8 from the floor and 2-2 from beyond the arc, using her high-post jumper to catch the FDU defense off guard.

Experience Galore

While there are many newcomers on the Notre Dame roster this year, it is an experienced group. This year's team has made 302 total NCAA starts over the course of their careers, including the five starters against FDU on Wednesday.

Of the newcomers, Cowles and de Jesus have ACC experience. After five years at Duke, de Jesus arrives in South Bend with three NCAA Tournament appearances and a 2025 Elite Eight berth with the Blue Devils.

Cowles boasts a lifetime shooting percentage of 55.0 and averaged 8.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per game last season, both career highs. When Notre Dame hosted Wake Forest last year, Cowles had a 15/10 double-double.

Moore also brings a vast amount of experience to this Irish roster. At Vanderbilt, she was named to the All-SEC Second

Team as a junior and has 1310 career points. She scored in double-figures 23 times last season for the Commodores.

Sophomore Sensation

After a historic freshman season, Hidalgo made history again last year. She was named to the AP All-America First Team, becoming the fourth player in NCAA history to be named a First Team All-American in their first two seasons (JuJu Watkins, Courtney Paris, Maya Moore). She was also ACC Player of the Year and ACC Defensive Player of the Year.

To get to that point, Hidalgo was named AP National Player of the Week, one of five USBWA Players of the Week and ACC Player of the Week four times. She earned the accolades after posting a near triple-double against **then-No. 2 UConn** (29p, 10r, 8a) and after dropping 24p, 6r, 8a and 5s at **then-No. 3 USC** on Nov. 23.

Last year, Hidalgo became the only player (male or female) to average 20.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 3.0 spg while shooting 40 percent Article continues on next page

from deep and 85 percent from the free throw line.

Additionally, Hidalgo scored her 1000th career point at Syracuse Dec. 8, becoming the fastest player in Notre Dame history to reach the mark. She did it in just 44 games. The previous record was 60 and held by Beth Morgan. She has now played 68 career collegiate games and has scored in double-figures in all 68.

In total last year, Hidalgo ranked fourth in the nation with 23.8 points per game and fourth with 3.7 swipes per game. Her points/ game mark was a program record, breaking her own mark from her freshman year (22.7).

Bransford Back

After redshirting last year, Bransford is back for her senior year. Known as a jack-of-all-trades, the Cincy native played every position except center during her sophomore year in 2023-24, and she averaged 6.8 points, 3.9 rebounds and 25.7 minutes per game in seven starts and 33 total appearances.

"Honestly, it was the best decision I've ever made," Bransford said of redshirting last season. "Having that year, it was my first time being able to have an offseason and being able to get my body right, my mind right. I've never had time away from basketball. [It



let me] reevaluate my game both on and off the court."

Bransford cited her **shooting and confidence** as the two major improvements she made this offseason.

Go Forth and Prosper

Just the second player to ever enroll early at Notre Dame, Prosper is now in her fourth year with the Irish and has improved steadily in each one. A model of consistency last year, Prosper was one of two Irish players to play in all 34 games and shot a career-best 45.9 percent from the floor.

Entering this season, Prosper feels she has grown as a leader over the summer having to play a large role in turning a new group of faces into a cohesive team both on and off the court.

Hometown Hero

After three years on the East Coast, Kelly Ratigan is home. The junior guard who went to St. Joseph High School —just 1.4 miles from Notre Dame's campus — returns to South Bend after three seasons at Loyola Maryland, although she played just three games last season due to injury.

While in high school down the street, Ratigan become St. Joseph's all-time scoring leader, was voted the Northern Indiana Athletic Conference's Most Valuable Player, and was named to the IBCA Large School All-State Team.

Additionally, her family has a long history with Notre Dame. Her father, Brian, played football at Notre Dame before playing for the Indianapolis Colts for four seasons. He is now an orthopedic surgeon for Irish athletics. Ratigan's brother Conor was a walk-on on the football team from 2019-22 as well

"There are little things here and there that remind me 'Man, this is the program I've looked up to for so many year,' Ratigan told the media on Oct. 22. "The next big thing for me will be putting on the uniform with 'Ratigan' on the back...The first game of the year will be a full circle moment for me for sure, but I come in every day just ready to work."

Impressive Start to Ivey Era

When Ivey took over the program from HOFer Muffet McGraw, she wanted to put her own spin on it. Mission accomplished.

In the six seasons since she took over, Notre Dame, UConn and Iowa are the only major conference teams to average over 76 ppg, shoot 34+ percent from deep and 46+ percent from the floor.

Also in the Ivey Era, Notre Dame leads the ACC with 77.0 ppg, 2596 assists and a FG% of 46.3.

Finally, Ivey recorded her 100th career win with a victory over Virginia on Dec. 29. In doing so, she became the fastest coach in program history to reach the milestone and is now the fastest coach in ACC history to reach 100 wins to begin a head coaching career.

Giant Killers

The Irish have been giant killers over the last three years. There's no other way to put it.

Last season, No. 8 Notre Dame defeated No. 2 UConn, 79-68 on Dec. 12. It was the fifth straight game against a top-five opponent the Irish have won, with three of them coming last year:

- No. 2 UConn 79-68 (12/12/24)
- No. 4 Texas 80-70 OT (12/5/24)
- No. 3 USC 74-61 (11/23/24)
- No. 5 Virginia Tech 71-58 (2/29/24)
- No. 3 UConn 74-60 (12/4/24)

In the last 10 years of men's and women's college basketball, no team has won five consecutive games against top-five

competition by double-digits. Until then.

Additionally, it was the first time in program history that the Irish have toppled three top-five programs during the regular season. Notre Dame had eight total ranked wins last year.

One of the finest point guards ever to wear the Notre Dame uniform, Niele Ivey (first name pronounced kneeelle) was announced as the fourth Karen & Kevin Keves Family Head Women's Basketball Coach on April 22, 2020. just mere minutes after Muffet McGraw stepped down.

Ivey's list of accolades since Year 1 is lengthy, including being the fastest coach in program history to reach 100 wins and the fastest ACC coach to reach 100 wins to start a head coaching career. She also won the 2024 ACC Tournament, was the 2023 ACC Coach of the Year, and led her team to at least a share of the ACC regular season title in 2023 and 2025. Ivey has posted four consecutive Sweet 16 appearances despite losing multiple starters in multiple seasons. Irish guard Hannah Hidalgo is reigning ACC Player and Defensive Player of the Year, and Notre Dame had five total players earn ACC postseason honors, including three on the All-ACC First Team.

As an assistant, the Irish went 386-55 (.875) during Ivey's time patrolling the sidelines. Notre Dame's recent decade of dominance (2010-19) had Ivey's handprints all over it – no other program had produced more trips to the national title game (six), and the Irish posted the third-most wins in that span as well (339).

Ivey is the common link to all nine of the program's Final Four appearances, two as a player and seven as an assistant coach, logging a combined 21 years on Notre Dame's campus (16 as a coach and five as a player).

That decade also consisted of 14 conference championships (eight regular-season plus six tournament titles split between the BIG EAST and ACC), seven Final Fours and a 2018 national championship.

Prior to taking over the top position at her alma mater, Ivey expanded her basketball prowess when she stepped away from Notre Dame to accept an assistant coaching position with the Memphis Grizzlies for the 2019-20 season. Ivey proved to be a true trailblazer, becoming the ninth active female coach in the NBA.

Over that year, Ivey helped develop a young team, with a new coaching staff, into a playoff contender. Ivey worked with several different position groups with the Grizzlies, but primarily with standout guards Jarien Jackson and Ja Morant, as the latter won 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year

Ivey originally joined the Fighting Irish women's basketball coaching staff in May 2007 (she added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2012 and was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015). She spent 12 seasons under Coach McGraw.

Over her last eight years as an assistant, Notre Dame ranked in the top-12 in field goal percentage (led the country in 2013-14 season), scoring offense and assists. In fact, Notre Dame's offense over its back- to-back title game runs in 2018 and 2019 was one for the record books. The 2018 championship squad ranked in the top five in all the aforementioned categories. Meanwhile, the 2019 Irish took home the statistical championship for top-scoring offense in the country, averaging a program-record 88.6 points per game. In addition, they broke the program record for assists (804) while finishing second in shooting percentage (50.8 percent). The stat that is the icing on the cake to all of this — the 2019 starting five of Ogunbowale, Mabrey, Shepard, Turner and Young went down as the most prolific scoring fivesome in the history of NCAA Division I basketball (men's or women's), amassing an astonishing 10,230 combined career points.

In addition to her achievements in player development, Ivey emerged as a rising star on the recruiting trail, with a sharp eye for young talent. In fact, she helped Notre Dame attract top-12 incoming classes in nine of her last 10 years.

What's more, Ivey displayed brilliant prowess when it came to scouting and in-game strategy. In her last six years as an assistant, she was directly responsible for creating the game plans that led to victories over Duke (12 times), Tennessee (8 times), Florida State (7 times), Connecticut (5 times). Maryland (three times). Louisville (8 times). Syracuse (7 times), UCLA (three times), Baylor (twice), Texas A&M (3 times) and South Carolina, among many others.

In fact, Notre Dame is 5-3 all-time against UConn in the NCAA Tournament, which more than doubles the next best team's win total. Overall, over her last 12 years, the Irish knocked off the Huskies nine times, while all other Division I teams combined for 10 wins.

Most notable players under Ivey's tutelage as an assistant: Arike Ogunbowale, Jewell Loyd and Skylar Diggins-Smith. Ogunbowale was a two-time All-American, two-time Ann Meyers Drysdale Award finalist and the 2018 Final Four MVP after her famous Ice Twice. Ogunbowale graduated as the program's all-time leading scorer.

Ivey helped mold Loyd into one of the country's top players from 2012-15. Loyd finished with 1,909 points and a 17.0 career points-per-game average. Loyd's best performances came against Top 25 teams, in which she averaged 22.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.2 assists per game, including a school record-tying 41 at DePaul.

Under Ivey's guidance, Skylar Diggins-Smith made a seamless transition from shooting guard to point guard during her final three seasons, emerging as one of the nation's elite players to become one of just three twotime recipients of the Lieberman Award and a two-time consensus first-team All-America and BIG EAST Player of the Year selection. Diggins-Smith graduated in 2013 as the holder (or co-holder) of no fewer than 32 game, season or career records at Notre Dame, and ranks among the top five on an astounding 105 of the program's game, season or

Ivey sat out most of her freshman season at Notre Dame (1996-97 Final Four campaign) after suffering a season-ending knee injury five games in. However, she was awarded a fifth year of eligibility in 2000-01 and made the most of it, earning third-team AP All-America honors, the first Fighting Irish point guard to be so recognized. She also was the recipient of the 2001 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award and was a finalist for the 2001 Lieberman Award, Ivey made the 2001 NCAA Women's Final Four All-Tournament Team after averaging 16.5 points and 5.5 steals per game as the Irish defeated UConn and Purdue to win their first national title.

All told, Notre Dame went 109-22 (.832) during Ivey's last four seasons, reaching the NCAA Sweet 16 three times (1998, 2000, 2001) and rolling up a (then) school-record 34 wins in 2000-01. The Fighting Irish also won a share of their first BIG EAST regular-season championship in 2000-01 and were ranked in the top 10 of either or both the Associated Press and WBCA/USA Today polls for all but two weeks during her final three campaigns. While at Notre Dame, Ivey was a three-time all-BIG EAST selection (1999-2001), collecting first-team honors in 2001, and was tapped as the BIG EAST Player of the Week five times. She also led the Fighting Irish in steals in each of her final four seasons (1997-98 to 2000-01) and was the team's assist leader in her last three years, setting school records with 95 steals in 1999-2000 (since topped by Diggins) and 247 assists in 2000-01, along with a school-standard 2.67 assist/turnover ratio the latter season.

Ivey went on to play five seasons in the WNBA, beginning with her selection by the Indiana Fever in the second round (17th overall pick) of the 2001 WNBA Draft. She spent four seasons with the Fever, helping them to the first playoff berth in franchise history in 2002. Ivey signed with the Detroit Shock as a restricted free agent in 2005, and subsequently was acquired by the Phoenix Mercury later that season.

A native of St. Louis, Ivey graduated from Notre Dame's College of Arts and Letters in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in history.

Alma Mater: Northern Illinois '90 26th Year at Notre Dame

One of the nation's premier post coaches, Carol Owens finished her 25th year at Notre Dame and her 16th as associate head coach for the Fighting Irish in 24-25, having originally been elevated to that position by Muffet McGraw prior to the 2002-03 season (holding

that role through the 2004-05 campaign), and then again in the summer of 2012.

Throughout her tenure at Notre Dame, Owens has focused on working with the Irish post players, while also assisting with the program's nationally-ranked recruiting efforts. She has been a part of two national championship teams while in South Bend.

Owens was named the 2019 WBCA Division I Assistant Coach of the Year along with being inducted into the inaugural STEP UP Assistant Coach Hall of Fame. In 2014, she was chosen as the inaugural recipient of the A Step Up Assistant Coach of the Year Award. In 2001, she was named one of the top five assistant coaches in the country by Women's Basketball Journal, and in 2011. CollegeInsider.com named her as one of the top 15 active assistants in the nation.

Owens has had the magic touch when it comes to developing elite post players over the years, with no fewer than seven of her pupils (Natalie Achonwa, Jacqueline Batteast, Katryna Gaither, Ruth Riley, Devereaux Peters, Jessica Shepard and Brianna Turner) earning a combined 34 All-America honors during their college careers.

Between her coaching runs at Notre Dame, Owens spent five seasons (2005-10) as head coach at her alma mater, Northern Illinois University. Owens originally came to Notre Dame in 1995 following two seasons as an assistant at Michigan, where she began her coaching career after enjoying a three-year professional playing stint in Japan, Spain and Italy.

As a standout player at Northern Illinois from 1985-90, Owens compiled a very impressive resume. A two-time Kodak (now WBCA) Coaches' All-District IV Team selection (1989 and 1990), Owens scored 2,102 points and averaged 18.0 points per game over four campaigns, covering 117 games. She also captained the Huskies for four seasons and, in her final collegiate campaign (1989-90), she guided NIU to the best record in school history (26-5), as the Huskies went undefeated in North Star Conference play (12-0) and earned the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament bid.

Owens finished her NIU career with 13 school records, most notably standing as Northern Illinois' all-time leader in scoring, blocked shots, free throws made, free throw attempts and field-goal percentage scoring games. In addition, she was the first player (male or female) in school history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

A native of Chicago, Owens received her bachelor of arts degree in communications in 1990. She was selected by the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to serve as Commencement Marshal of her graduating class and was named Northern Illinois' Outstanding Woman. In addition, Owens was the recipient of the Student Leadership Award.

Alma Mater: Notre Dame '16 Seventh Year at Notre Dame

On August 26, 2019, Michaela Mabrey came home, joining then-Muffet McGraw's staff as an assistant coach. Now under Karen & Kevin Keyes Family Head Coach Niele Ivey, Michaela just

completed her sixth season in 2024-25. She also added the title of recruiting coordinator in 2022.

Years three through six have been extremely successful for Mabrey after bringing in Olivia Miles and Sonia Citron and serving as their position coach. Last season, Miles and Citron were both named to the All-ACC First Team with Miles earning Second Team All-America honors (Citron was HM).

In 2021-22, Notre Dame was the only program with two freshmen on ESPN's top-10 freshman list (Miles No. 2 / Citron No. 6). Additionally, the Irish were just one of two programs in all of Division I who had two freshmen both average doubledigit points.

As a freshman, Miles ranked 2nd in the entire nation in assists per game (7.4), led the team in scoring (13.7 ppg), posted nine double-doubles including two triple-doubles and was a Nancy Lieberman Award Top 5 Finalist. Not to mention, she was First-Team All-ACC. Citron was the 2022 ACC Freshman of the Year after averaging 11.8 points, 6.6 rebounds. In fact, she was one of two freshmen in the entire country who averaged at least 11 points, 6 rebounds, 2 assists and 1.5 steals.

In her first year with the Irish, Mabrey was instantly recognized by the WBCA, landing on their Thirty Under 30 honoree list. Each honoree has exemplified their involvement in community service, mentorship and impact on others, professional manner, and attitude and professional association involvement.

Part of the winningest class in Notre Dame women's basketball history (2012-16), Mabrey's squads advanced to three Final Fours, including two title game appearances (2014 & 2015). The

Irish also swept regular season and conference tournament titles all four years in which Mabrey was on campus (one Big East + three ACC). In addition, Mabrey served as a team captain in her final two seasons

Over her time at Notre Dame, Mabrey emerged as one of the elite three-point shooters in the country. The New Jersey native finished her career with 228 made three-pointers (fifth all-time), a .396 three-point shooting percentage (sixth all-time) and played in 142 total games (ninth all-time). Michaela and her sister Marina were the only two Fighting Irish players to make at least 60 three-pointers in three seasons.

After graduation, Mabrey became the coordinator of program and player development at the University of Miami for the 2016-17 season, aiding the staff in preparing scouting material and conducting on-campus recruiting visits. The following year. Mabrey moved to Miami (Ohio) as an assistant, where the Redhawks went on to produce a 21-11 record and recorded the biggest turn-around that year in NCAA Division I by a first-year coaching staff.

For the 2018-19 season, Mabrey accepted a Director of Recruiting position at LSU. There she coordinated the daily recruiting operational and logistical processes for the women's basketball program.

Alma Mater: Notre Dame '08 Fourth Year at Notre Dame

This past year was Allen's third season as an assistant coach at Notre Dame. She has been critical in developing ACC Player of the Year and two-time Defensive Player of the Year Hannah Hidalgo, serving as her position coach and helping lead her to

breaking nearly every freshman program record on the books. Hidalgo led the nation with 4.6 steals per game in 2023-24 and was the country's No. 2 scoring freshman with 22.6 points per contest. Both of those marks are also Notre Dame single-season program records across all classes, and Hidalgo topped that scoring mark in 2024-25 with 23.8 points/game.

During her inaugural year back on campus, the former Irish guard helped lead Notre Dame to a regular season ACC title using elite guard play. Along with Mabrey, Allen helped coach All-American Olivia Miles and All-ACC shooter Sonia Citron, leading Notre Dame to a second straight Sweet 16 berth.

Niele Ivey announced Charel Allen as a new assistant coach on July 20, 2022. Allen graduated from Notre Dame in 2008, becoming one of three current Irish coaches to have graduated from the school.

Allen was a two-time All-American, two-time First Team All-Big East selection and served as team captain over her final two seasons at Notre Dame. Allen averaged team bests 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds as a junior then led the Irish to a Sweet 16 berth during her senior year, scoring a careerhigh 35 points in a second-round overtime win over Oklahoma – which still stands tied for the second-best Irish scoring performance in the NCAA Tournament.

She was the first player in school history to amass

1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 200 steals in her career. In fact, she still ranks 15th on the all-time scoring list with 1,566 career points.

Allen was selected in the third round of the 2008 WNBA Draft by the Sacramento Monarchs, helping the team advance to the '08 WNBA Playoffs.

In 2009, Allen made the leap overseas and played professionally in Bulgaria for eight seasons. She was a five-time Bulgarian League champion in addition to being named a four-time All-Bulgarian League First Team selection, with Player of the Year honors in 2014.

In the summer of 2017, Allen made the shift to the coaching ranks and joined the staff at Cal State Fullerton. She was then promoted to associate head coach in May of 2021. At Fullerton, Allen helped with recruiting along with coaching the wings for the Titans. In her first year, Allen saw her shooting guard Hannah Thompson average 12.4 points per game and convert 72 three-pointers. A year later, freshman Amiee Book went on to win the Big West Sixth Player of the Year.

In January, Allen was announced as part of the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic League Hall of Fame Class of 2025. She helped lead her high school, Monessen, to a 100-19 record and the 2004 WPIAL and PIAA Class 1A girls' basketball championships. She was named Associated Press Pennsylvania Class 1A Player of the Year in 2003 and 2004 and averaged 26.1 points, 8.1 rebounds, 5.4 assists, and 5.1 steals per game for the Greyhounds as a senior.

Alma Mater: IUPUI '98 Third Year at Notre Dame

Knox joined the Irish as the new player development program director on June 12, 2023 and had an immensely successful first two seasons in South Bend. He was promoted to an assistant coach in the summer of 2025. Individually, he primarily worked with Irish forward Maddy Westbeld, who posted her best season on the court to date in 2023-24. Westbeld averaged 14.4 points and 8.7 rebounds per game, and she was named to the All-ACC Second Team. With 297 total rebounds, Westbeld's 2023-24 season on the boards ranks eighth in program history, and her 940 career rebounds rank seventh. Knox's role in Westbeld's life was arguably even bigger off the court, as he augmented her work ethic and leadership skills. She was ultimately the No. 16 overall pick in the 2025 WNBA Draft, heading to the Chicago Sky.

Last year, Knox was also the position coach for Pittsburgh transfer Liatu King. Ultimately the No. 28 overall pick in the 2025 WNBA Draft (Los Angeles Sparks), King averaged 10.4 rebounds per game last year, a Notre Dame record previously held by WNBA veteran Jessica Shepard. She also notched 342 total boards, fith in program history for a single season.

King ranked in the top 35 nationally in three major categories — field goal percentage (56.3 — 25th), rebounds per game (10.4 - 17th) and double-doubles (14 - 31st). She was named to the All-ACC Second Team

Prior to coming to Notre Dame, Knox spent nearly a decade working with the Indiana Fever as an interim head coach, assistant coach and player development coach. During his tenure in Indianapolis, Knox helped lead the team to eight consecutive WNBA playoff appearances and was a 2012 WNBA champion. He helped with everything from scouting to rehabilitation training to practice preparation. He has worked with

many notable players, including former Irish guard Skylar Diggins, four-time Olympic gold medalist Tamika Catchings and five-time WNBA All-Star Katie Douglas.

Knox has also had stints as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati (2020-21), University of North Texas (2017-20) and San Diego State University (2010-11). Finally, Knox spent time from 2015-16 as the director of training at the Jonathan Byrd Grand Park Fieldhouse, Indiana's state-of-the-art basketball

The former point guard had a lengthy and decorated career as a collegiate player after attending high school outside of Dayton, Ohio. While earning a degree in communications from IUPUI from 1994-98, he was a two-time NCAA scoring champion, NCAA All-American and NCAA Player of the Year. His jersey has been retired at IUPUI, and the team became a Division I program just after his graduation due in part to Knox's contributions. He was inducted into the IUPUI Hall of Fame in 2004.

Knox went on to play for the Indiana Pacers from 1998-99 and played overseas in Croatia, Germany, Venezuela and Italy. He has also served as a head coach in the International Basketball League. Continental Basketball Association and American Basketball Association.

The newest member of the Notre Dame staff comes to South Bend from Dallas.
