TOP STORYLINES

► Michigan and Notre Dame are squaring off for the second straight season, playing in the Shamrock Classic at the Wayne State Fieldhouse.

► Notre Dame came away with a 76-55 win over Michigan in the second round of the 2025 NCAA Tournament in South Bend. This is only the second neutral-site game between the regional rivals.

► No. 18 Notre Dame is the first ranked opponent of the season for Michigan. U-M picked up wins over three ranked teams last season.

► Michigan has four players scoring in double figures in **Mila Holloway** (19.0 ppg), **Olivia Olson** (18.0 ppg), **Syla Swords** (11.5 ppg) and **Ashley Sofilkanich** (10.0 ppg).

► Michigan and Notre Dame are two of the highest scoring offenses nationally, with the Irish coming in at No. 8 (99.7 ppg) and Michigan listed at No. 18 (92.0 ppg).

► The Wolverines recorded 25 steals against Canisius, the sixth-highest total in program history. It was the first time since 2008 that U-M had at least 20 steals and just the second time this century. Michigan is second in the Big Ten in steals per game at 17.5.

► **Mila Holloway** is 8th in the Big Ten in scoring and third in field goal percentage at 76.2. She is the only guard in the conference to be shooting at least 70.0 percent from the field.

► This is the first of two contests in Detroit for Michigan, which plays at Detroit Mercy on Nov. 26. It is the first time for U-M in Detroit since the 2017-18 season when the Wolverines played at Calihan Hall.

Last Time Out

The No. 13-ranked University of Michigan women's basketball team never trailed, turning 26 turnovers into 27 points en route to an 84-55 win over Harvard on Sunday afternoon (Nov. 9) at Crisler Center. With the victory, Michigan moves to 2-0 on the season.

Olivia Olson led a trio of Wolverines in double figures with 18 points on 6-for-9 shooting from the floor, adding four rebounds in just 21 minutes of action. **Mila Holloway** contributed 17 points, three rebounds, three assists and two steals, while **Syla Swords** added 14 points, five rebounds, two assists and two steals. **Brooke Quarles Daniels** filled the stat sheet with seven points, four rebounds and five assists. U-M shot 55.4 percent (31-for-56) from the floor while holding Harvard to 32.7 percent (18-for-55).

Swords connected on a triple right off the tip to give Michigan an early lead. Harvard tied the game at 7-7 with 7:13 left in the first quarter before U-M uncorked a 17-0 run that began with an Olson layup. Five Wolverines scored during the run, which was capped by a Holloway jumper with seven seconds remaining for a 24-7 Michigan advantage. A Harvard free throw with less than a second left broke the drought as U-M held a 24-8 lead after 10 minutes.

The Crimson matched the Wolverines in the second quarter with each team scoring 16 points. Michigan's lead shrunk to 10 (34-24) with 1:01 left before halftime, but **Ciara Byars** came off the bench to score back-to-back buckets. Quarles Daniels then converted off a steal from Swords for a quick 6-0 spurt to end the quarter, pushing Michigan's advantage to 40-24 at the break.

U-M continued to push the pace in the second half, scoring 21 points in the third quarter and 23 in the fourth. Olson led the way with nine second-half points, while Holloway added eight and three other Wolverines scored at least five.

Michigan led by as many as 29 points in the closing minutes, with all 14 Wolverines seeing action in the win.

Notre Dame Ties

This will be the second time in as many seasons that U-M general manager **Natalie Achonwa** will be on the sidelines opposite her alma mater. A four-year letterwinner at Notre Dame (2011-14), she earned All-America third-team honors by the Associated Press as a senior. Upon graduation, she ranked 12th all-time in scoring (1,546), third in games played (145), fourth in rebounding (970), fifth in double-doubles (28) and sixth in field goal percentage (.562). She graduated from Notre Dame in 2014 with a degree in management-consulting from ND's Mendoza College of Business.

Canadian Connections

Syla Swords will face a Canadian Olympic teammate in Notre Dame's **Cassandra Prosper**. The two also teamed up in the summer of 2023 with Canada, winning bronze at the FIBA AmeriCup and the U19 World Cup. Swords, Prosper and **Natalie Achonwa** were all part of Canada's 2024 Olympic team.

Wolverines and Irish

Michigan and Notre Dame are meeting for the 23rd time in program history, with the Irish holding a 14-8 advantage. Notre Dame came away with a 76-55 win over Michigan in the second round of the 2025 NCAA

Tournament in South Bend. This is just the second neutral-site game between the regional rivals. The teams faced each other in the Women's Basketball Showcase in Grand Rapids, Mich., on Dec. 2, 2001. U-M picked up a 78-63 win in that contest.

Sophomore Trio Not Missing a Beat

Michigan's sophomore trio of **Mila Holloway**, **Olivia Olson** and **Syla Swords** have not missed a beat this season, each averaging double figures in scoring. Holloway has led Michigan in scoring in one game and is averaging a team-high 19.0 points per game on 76.2 percent shooting as the only guard in the Big Ten to be shooting at least 70 percent. Olson led Michigan in scoring against Harvard (Nov. 9) and is averaging 18.0 points per game on 60.0 percent shooting. Swords has continued to do it all on both ends and is averaging 11.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game.

Defense, Defense, Defense

Michigan forced 45 turnovers against Canisius in the season opener (Nov. 4), tied for the second-most forced in a game this season. Canisius had more turnovers than points scored (40), marking the second time in as many seasons that Michigan has forced more turnovers than points allowed. LIU had 32 turnovers and 31 points in a 96-31 Michigan win last season on Nov. 20, 2024. Michigan is second nationally in turnovers forced per game, forcing 35.5 per game.

Holloway, Quarles Daniels Swipe Away

Brooke Quarles Daniels and **Mila Holloway** each set new career highs in steals against the Golden Griffins (Nov. 4), with BQD going for eight and Holloway for seven. Quarles Daniels' eight steals is tied for the fifth-most by a player in program history, with Holloway ranking 14th.

Sofilkanich Hits 1K

Ashley Sofilkanich joined the 1,000-point club for her career in the season opener, scoring just four seconds into the game to reach the mark. She scored 998 points during two seasons at Bucknell and is up to 1,018 for her career. She is one of 137 active Division I players with at least 1,000 points.

Sophomore Success in the Opener

Mila Holloway started her sophomore season off with a bang, tying her career highs in points (21) and assists (8) while recording a career-best seven steals. **Te'Yala Delfosse** came off the bench and set new career bests with 14 points and six rebounds.

Where We Rank

The Wolverines are ranked No. 14 in this week's Associated Press poll after starting the season at No. 13. U-M is listed at No. 15 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

KBA Enters 14th Year

J. Ira and Nicki Harris Family Head Women's Basketball Coach **Kim Barnes Arico** enters her 14th season in Ann Arbor as the winningest coach in Michigan basketball history - men or women. With 12 of Michigan's 16 all-time 20-win seasons, she is first all-time in winning percentage (.664) with a 286-144 record in Ann Arbor. KBA is 14 wins away from becoming the first coach to record 300 victories in Ann Arbor.

Watch List SZN

Michigan has been well-represented on various watch lists during the preseason. **Syla Swords** (Ann Meyers Drysdale Shooting Guard), **Olivia Olson** (Cheryl Miller Small Forward) and **Ashley Sofilkanich** (Lisa Leslie Center) were each named to the Basketball Hall of

Fame positional watch lists. In addition, Swords and Olson were each named to the Naismith Trophy Watch List.

About Last Season

Michigan is coming off a 23-11 season in 2024-25, making the NCAA Tournament for the 13th time in program history. U-M knocked off Iowa State in the first round, winning its first-round contest for the seventh time in eight tries under KBA. U-M has made appearances in the last seven NCAA Tournaments, dating back to the 2018 edition. It is the longest streak in program history.

Stacked Schedule

For the second straight season, Michigan will face the defending champion and preseason No. 1-ranked team during the non-conference portion of the season. Last season, U-M dropped a 68-64 decision to No. 1 South Carolina, with the Maize and Blue facing No. 1 UConn in the opening game of the Basketball Hall of Fame Women's Showcase (Nov. 21) at Mohegan Sun.

Conference Schedule

Michigan will once again play 18 Big Ten games, facing 16 schools once and playing a home-and-home series with Michigan State. U-M will host Purdue in its early Big Ten contest on Dec. 7 and head to the Pacific Northwest following the holiday break. In addition to Purdue, U-M will host games against Minnesota, Illinois, Wisconsin, Maryland, UCLA, USC, Michigan State and Nebraska. Following its trip to Oregon and Washington, Michigan will also hit the road for games at Rutgers, Indiana, Michigan State, Iowa, Penn State, Ohio State and Northwestern.

Staff on the Sidelines

Michigan welcomes new assistant coaches **Jordann Reese** and **Danielle Rauch** to the sidelines this season. Reese had been on the coaching staff at Creighton, with Rauch returning to her alma mater after a year on the sidelines at Western Carolina. **Justine Raterman** enters her second season, along with **Natalie Achonwa**, who added General Manager to her title. **Melanie Moore** is in her third season as an assistant coach in her second stint at Michigan. Amy Mulligan is in her 14th year as the director of operations, with Dillon Carson (Director of Video and Analytics) and Makayla Daniels (Graduate Manager) entering their first seasons on staff.

Catch Us On TV

Michigan will appear on national television 19 times during the upcoming season. U-M will play on the Big Ten Network five times, with four games slated to air on Peacock. The Wolverines play at least four times each on FS1 and FOX, with the Feb. 22 game at Iowa to appear on one of the networks. Michigan's neutral-site contest against Notre Dame will air on NBC.

Strong Non-Con

The Wolverines will play 11 non-conference games, facing four Power Four opponents in No. 1 UConn, No. 15 Notre Dame, No. 19 Vanderbilt and Syracuse. U-M will play all four of those games away from Ann Arbor, with six non-conference games slated for Crisler Center.

Olson, Swords Historically Great as Freshmen

Since the 2009-10 season, there have only been eight players in Big Ten history (school was in the Big Ten at the time) to average at least 15.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game as freshmen. **Olivia Olson** (16.3 ppg, 5.3 rpg) and **Syla Swords** (16.0 ppg, 6.2 rpg) joined that list last season. Other players to have accomplished that are Caitlin Clark, Jessica Shepard, Rachel Banham, Nia Coffey, Amanda Zahui B. and Cotie McMahon.

Three McDonald's All-Americans in A2

For the second straight season, Michigan has multiple McDonald's All-Americans on its roster in **Kendall Dudley**, **Olivia Olson** and **Syla Swords**. All three were named McDonald's All-Americans in 2024. Swords and Olson are the first high school players to sign with Michigan who earned the honor. Dudley joins Michigan this season after playing last season at UCLA.

Wolverines in the W

Michigan has had three players see action in the WNBA during the last three seasons in **Naz Hillmon** (Atlanta), **Leigha Brown** (Connecticut) and **Cyesha Goree** (Washington). All three saw action in 2023, with Hillmon playing the last two seasons (2024, 2025) with Atlanta and winning 2025 WNBA Sixth Player of the Year honors. During 2023, it marked the first time Michigan has ever had three active players in the W at the same time.

J. Ira and Nicki Harris Family Head Women's Basketball Coach Kim Barnes Arico finished her 13th season as the head coach in 2024-25, relying on stellar freshman class and a pair of veteran returners to win 23 games and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Throughout her 13-year tenure, she has guided the Wolverines to at least 20 wins in 12 seasons, eight NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Elite Eight appearance (2022), an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance (2021) and the 2017 WNIT Championship. She was announced as the ninth head coach in the history of the program on April 20, 2012 and is the longest tenured coach in program history.

Barnes Arico is the winningest coach in program history with 284 wins, the only coach to ever eclipse 200 victories. With 12 of Michigan's 16 all-time 20-win seasons, she is first all-time in winning percentage (.664) with a 284-144 record in Ann Arbor. Barnes Arico holds a 167-43 (.795) record at Crisler Center after the first-ever undefeated mark (16-0) in 2021-22. KBA eclipsed the 500-win mark of her coaching career in a 76-59 win at Nebraska on Dec. 28, 2022. She is one of 29 active coaches with at least 500 career victories, entering the 2025-26 season with 554 victories.

KBA has taken Michigan women's basketball to new heights since taking over prior to the 2012-13 campaign, more than doubling U-M's NCAA Tournament appearances and making at least the second round seven times. Michigan has advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 twice under KBA, including a trip to the Elite Eight in 2021-22, as she holds a 10-8 record in the NCAA Tournament at Michigan. The Wolverines have won at least 20 games in 12 of her 13 seasons, only missing the mark during the 2020-21 season as U-M played just 22 total games. Michigan has made the postseason in every season that had a postseason contested (missing 2019-20 due to pandemic) under Barnes Arico, winning at least one game in all but one postseason appearance.

U-M has found itself back in the national spotlight as well during KBA's tenure, returning to the Associated Press poll in January 2013 for the first time in 10 years. Michigan was ranked in every Associated Press and USA Today Coaches poll for three straight seasons (2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23), peaking at No. 4 in both for the highest ranking in program history during the 2021-22 season. Michigan has been ranked for 89 weeks since the 2012-13 season, accounting for 87 percent of its overall appearances (102).

Barnes Arico is a two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2017, 2022) and was a semifinalist for the 2022 Werner Ladder Coach of the Year honor. Her players have combined to earn 12 All-Big Ten first-team honors from the coaches, 10 first-team honors from the media, 11 second-team honors from the coaches, 11 second-team honors from the media and a third-team honor from both before the teams were consolidated to two teams. She has had seven players earn Big Ten All-Freshman honors and three different players grab a spot on the defensive team. Five players have been named to the WBCA All-District team since 2012-13, each earning at least All-America honorable mention.

She coached U-M's first All-American and Big Ten Player of the Year, Naz Hillmon, along with all-time leading scorer and three-time All-Big Ten first-teamer, Katelynn Flaherty. Hillmon was named the 2021 Big Ten Player of the Year, making her just the second Big Ten player in conference history to earn Player, Freshman and Sixth Player of the Year honors during a career. Hillmon was a two-time WBCA All-American, while also earning honors twice by the Associated Press, USBWA, Sports Illustrated and the Athletic. The 2017-18 Michigan Female Athlete of the Year, Flaherty also earned three consecutive WBCA All-America honorable mentions (2016, 2017, 2018). Nicole Elmlad also earned back-to-back Academic All-America honors (2014, 2015) and was the recipient of the 2015 Big Ten Medal of Honor.

Michigan has had players picked in three of the last four WNBA drafts, with Hillmon going 15th to the Atlanta Dream in 2022, Leigha Brown going in the exact same slot to the Dream in 2023 and Jordan Hobbs picked 34th by the Seattle Storm in 2025. Brown and Hillmon are tied for the highest WNBA draft picks in program history.

She also is building quite the coaching tree as five of her former assistant coaches are now head coaches: Joe Tartamella (St. John's), Megan Duffy (Virginia Tech), Toyelle Wilson (Texas A&M Corpus Christi), Carrie Moore (Harvard) and Erin Bath (Providence).

With just four returners, five freshmen and three transfers, Michigan did not miss a beat in 2024-25 en route to winning 23 games and reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Olivia Olson and Syla Swords became the first freshman teammates in Big Ten history to each score 500 points in the same season, with Olson setting a new freshman program record with 553 points. Fellow freshman Mila Holloway set a new Michigan assists record for a freshman, handing out 148 assists on the season. Olson was named the Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Year, with her and Swords each earning a spot on the all-freshman team and the Big Ten second team. Michigan's 23 wins is tied for the third-most in program history, with the Wolverines making the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament for the second straight season. In a 70-67 win over Indiana (Feb. 12), Barnes Arico picked up her 279th win at Michigan - moving past John Beilein as the winningest coach in Michigan basketball history - men or women.

The Wolverines won 20 games in 2023-24, going 20-14 and making the NCAA Tournament for the sixth straight season after returning just a pair of starters from the season before. The Wolverines made a run to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament to cement their NCAA Tournament berth, punctuated by a 69-56 win over No. 12-ranked Indiana in the quarterfinals.

Michigan went 23-10 in 2022-23, weathering the departure of Hillmon to the WNBA and some tough injuries by relying on a balanced attack. U-M was ranked in each poll during the season, won the Gulf Coast Showcase and grabbed a top-10 win over North Carolina in the Jumpman Invitational. Brown and Emily Kiser grabbed All-Big Ten first-team honors from the coaches, with Laila Phelia honored with a second-team selection. U-M put four on the CSC Academic All-District team and nine on the Academic All-Big Ten team. Michigan knocked off UNLV in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual national champion LSU in Baton Rouge.

The 2021-22 season was full of highlights for the Maize and Blue, who advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. U-M went 25-7 on the season, the second-best win total and highest winning percentage in program history. The Wolverines picked up eight wins over ranked teams, again setting a new program standard. Michigan was ranked in both polls throughout the season, garnering the first top-five and top-10 rankings in school history. U-M finished No. 12 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches poll, both program highs. The Wolverines hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time as a No. 3 seed, recording wins over American and Villanova to punch their Sweet 16 ticket for the second straight season before knocking out South Dakota to advance. U-M went 16-0 at Crisler Center, the first undefeated home season in program history while averaging 3,676 fans.

Hillmon was a unanimous and consensus All-Big Ten first teamer, making her the first player in program history to earn four first-team nods. She also earned All-America first-team honors from the WBCA, USBWA, Associated Press, The Athletic, Sports Illustrated and the Wooden Award. Brown was named to the All-Big Ten second team, with Phelia grabbing a spot on the freshman team. The Wolverines put 10 on the Academic All-Big Ten team, while Brown, Maddie Nolan, Danielle Rauch and Kiser were named CoSIDA Academic All-District.

From 2018-21, U-M made three NCAA Tournament appearances, only missing the 2020 Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Wolverines won at least one game in all three tournaments, making the program's first-ever Sweet 16 appearance in 2021.

Barnes Arico led Michigan to its first postseason championship in 2016-2017, as the Wolverines captured the WNIT Championship after being left out of the NCAA Tour-



nament despite a third-place finish in the Big Ten. Michigan went 11-5 in conference play to finish alone in third place, its highest finish since 2011 and the second-most Big Ten wins in program history. The Wolverines regrouped during the WNIT, reeling off six straight wins for the title. U-M held off Georgia Tech in three overtimes in the championship game to hang its first banner in Crisler.

During KBA's first five seasons in the Maize and Blue, the Wolverines racked up at least 20 wins in each year and advanced to the postseason each time. In 2013-14, U-M weathered losing 88 percent of its scoring from the season before to still reach 20 wins and the third round of the WNIT with four new starters.

Barnes Arico also completed a two-year stint with USA Basketball (2014-15), serving as an assistant coach alongside Dawn Staley (South Carolina) and Jeff Walz (Louisville) for the U18 (2014) and U19 (2015) teams. She won a pair of gold medals at the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2015 and at the FIBA U18 America's Championship in 2014.

Prior to joining the Maize and Blue, she spent 10 seasons at the helm of the St. John's women's hoops program, building the Red Storm into a national power. She guided St. John's to four NCAA Tournament appearances, with the Red Storm advancing to the Sweet 16 in 2012.

Barnes Arico compiled a 176-133 overall record and five 20-win campaigns at St. John's. She was a two-time Big East Coach of the Year (2006, 2012) and had 11 players earn All-Big East honors, with six receiving all-rookie team nods.

In 2011-12, St. John's posted a 24-10 overall record and finished second (13-3) in the Big East standings. St. John's finished No. 15 in the final USA Today Coaches poll and reached its highest-ever ranking of No. 13 by the Associated Press. The highlight of the season was when Barnes Arico and her Red Storm ended Connecticut's 99-game home winning streak with a 57-56 win on Feb. 19, 2012 at Gampel Pavilion. It was also UConn's first home loss to an unranked opponent in nearly 19 years.

Prior to accepting her position at St. John's, Barnes Arico was extremely successful at NCAA Division II Adelphi (1999-2002). She led the Panthers to three consecutive postseason appearances, posting a 65-24 overall record and a 51-13 league mark.

She was inducted into the Adelphi Hall of Fame in 2014.

In 2001-02, Adelphi won its first New York Collegiate Athletic Conference (NYCAC) championship and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers finished with a 28-3 record and earned the school's first national ranking in school history, finishing No. 12. Barnes Arico was named the NYCAC, NIT/Metropolitan Basketball Writers Division II and Nassau County Sports Commission Outstanding Female Coach of the Year.

Barnes Arico started her head-coaching career at Fairleigh Dickinson-Madison, a Division III university in New Jersey. She led the Devils to a 13-11 record during the 1996-97 season before accepting the head coaching post at New Jersey Institute of Technology for two seasons (1997-99). Helping the program transition from Division III to Division II, Barnes Arico was named the New Jersey Coach of the Year after taking the program from the five-win total in her first season to 11 victories in year two.

A native of Mastic Beach, N.Y., Barnes Arico helped lead Stony Brook University to the 1989 NCAA Division III Tournament as a freshman. She spent her final three seasons at Montclair State University, serving as captain during her junior and senior seasons. Barnes Arico led the team to back-to-back ECAC Tournament appearances in 1991 and 1992 and was the team's leading scorer both seasons. A scholar-athlete award recipient, Barnes Arico graduated from Montclair State in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and health.

Barnes Arico went into teaching after graduation, accepting a position as a physical education and health teacher at the Academy of Saint Aloysius in Jersey City, N.J., during the 1993-94 academic year. She left Saint Aloysius and moved into an identical position at Chatham High School from 1994-96 in Chatham, N.J.

Barnes Arico and her husband, Larry Arico, are the parents of a son, Trevor, and daughters Emma and Cecelia. Emma is currently a sophomore on the women's lacrosse team and Trevor is a graduate manager for the men's basketball program.
