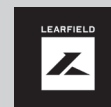

Finishing off November undefeated, Ole Miss is set to compete in the annual ACC/SEC Challenge, as it will take on its first top 25 opponent this season in Notre Dame at the SJB Pavilion on Thursday.

2

The Rebels are undefeated through the first seven games of the season for the first time since the 2008-09 season, the third time in the 21st century and the 13th time in program history.

Christeen Iwuala was named to the Coast 2 Coast Classic All-Tournament First Team, scoring a total of 41 points and grabbing 18 rebounds through the Rebels' two games in Florida.

4

Christeen Iwuala and Cotie McMahon continue to be a dominant frontcourt tandem, becoming the first Rebel duo to score at least 10 points through the first seven games of the season since at least 1998-99.

5

Coach Yo is currently in her eighth season at the helm, continuing to take the Rebels to new heights after appearing in the Sweet 16 for the second time in three years and four consecutive NCAA Tournaments.

Head coach Yolett McPhee-McCuin has elevated Ole Miss women's basketball back into the national spotlight throughout her seven seasons in Oxford. McPhee-McCuin keeps building upon her success each season at the helm of the Rebels, leading Team 50 to its fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024-25 for its 21st overall.

McPhee-McCuin is solidifying herself as one of the most highly touted coaches in history, earning 20 overall wins and 10 conference victories for the fourth consecutive season. She is the only coach in program history to achieve this feat. McPhee-McCuin led her team to defeat two top-10 conference opponents, the first time a Rebel team has done this since the 1995-96 season.

Along with a successful conference season, Ole Miss dictated and disrupted throughout all 12 nonconference games, entering SEC play with the best scoring defense in the nation only allowing 46.7 points per game. Additionally, the Rebels set three single-game program records, securing the best field goal percentage, fewest points allowed and widest margin of victory.

Madison Scott went above and beyond in her fifth and final year under McPhee-McCuin, being named All-SEC Second Team and earning WBCA All-America Honorable Mention honors. Sira Thienou proved to be an important key in the Rebels' game, notching the second most steals by any Rebel freshman (79) to help earn her a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Defeating No. 14 Baylor on the Bears' home court, the Rebels secured their fourth ranked win of the season, marking the most in the McPhee-McCuin era. The victory advanced Ole Miss to its 12th Sweet 16 in program history and second appearance in three years.

Along with guiding the Rebels to a program best in conference wins, McPhee-McCuin picked up her 100th win at the helm of Ole Miss during the 2023-24 season to become the second coach in program history to achieve the feat.

Bringing the Rebels back to her home country of the Bahamas, McPhee-McCuin and the Rebels clinched their second tournament victory as the Rebels went on to win three games in three days to claim the 2023 Battle4Atlantis Championship. Two Rebels earned a spot on the all-tournament team in Marquessa Davis and Madison Scott, with Scott taking home Most Valuable Player Honors.

The duo of Davis and Scott continued to excel throughout the conference season, with the pair becoming the first Rebels to both earn First Team All-SEC accolades in the same season since 1989.

McPhee-McCuin's signature defense also led the Rebels to break multiple program records, including Ole Miss shattering a single-season best of 190 blocks. Holding 11 opponents to under 50 points also set a school record in a single season.

In the First Round of the 2024 NCAA Tournament, McPhee-McCuin picked up her third tournament victory as a head coach as the Rebels marched past Marquette.

The 2022-23 campaign generated plenty of noise in leading the Rebels to its 19th NCAA Tournament appearance and shook up the country in advancing to its 11th Sweet 16 in program history.

Cultivating a roster through the use of the transfer portal and with Rebel returners, McPhee-McCuin guided a team with seven newcomers to its second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance for the first time since the 2004 & 2005 seasons. Reaching 20-wins also hit another milestone for Ole Miss, reaching the 20-win mark in back-to-back seasons for the only time since 1993-94 & 1994-95.

After reaching an 11-2 mark through its non-conference slate, Ole Miss hit the ground running at the start of SEC play by rattling off five consecutive victories to begin 5-0. One of these first five wins included the Rebels' first win over Mississippi State in Starkville since 2004. The Rebels kept their momentum rolling against the Bulldogs in Oxford, completing the first regular season sweep over MSU since 2004.

This Rebel squad came together in multiple ways when facing adversity, including engineering the best comeback in program history after facing a 19-point deficit at halftime at Arkansas. Defensively, Ole Miss clamped down on the Razorbacks to erase the Arkansas lead and force overtime. From then on, it was all Ole Miss to complete the comeback and take down Arkansas, 76-73. Not only was it the largest comeback in program history, but the third biggest between two SEC teams and ranks ninth in the NCAA record book.

The wins continued to come, with Ole Miss earning 11 SEC victories to tie a program record and seal its second-straight fourth place finish. The 11 victories were the most for the Rebels since the conference went to the 16-game SEC schedule. Following an appearance in the SEC Tournament Semifinals, the Rebels heard their name called on Selection Sunday as an eight seed to reach the program's 19th NCAA Tournament appearance.

A dominant First-Round, 71-48 victory over No. 8 Gonzaga highlighted by its trademark defense kept the Bulldogs at bay with a program-lowest in points allowed in an NCAA Tournament game. Going up against No. 1 Stanford in the Second-Round, Ole Miss took control of the Cardinal in a game in which they never trailed to knock off the top-seeded host team, 54-49 to reach the Rebels' 11th Sweet 16. The Rebels became the first team since 2009 to halt a No. 1 seed from advancing to the third round.

Development has been a key theme for McPhee-McCuin, by molding transfer Angel Baker into a First Team All-SEC point guard and a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. In her third year with Madison Scott, the 2021 SEC Freshman of the Year, elevated her game to earn Second Team All-SEC and All Defensive Team honors for 2023.

McPhee-McCuin wrapped up her fourth season in Oxford in 2021-22 with revitalized energy surrounding the Ole Miss women's basketball program, leading the Rebels to their 18th NCAA Tournament appearance and their first in 15 seasons with one of the most tenacious defenses

in the country.

The 2021-22 campaign was one to be remembered, as McPhee-McCuin raised the bar with the expectation of the NCAA Tournament or bust from the get-go, Ole Miss rose to the occasion, accomplishing just that. Following a season-opening loss, the Rebels responded by rattling off 13 straight wins for the third-longest winning streak in program history on the way to a 23-win season.

Following its second-ranked win of the season at No. 23 Kentucky and fourth-straight in SEC play, the Rebels saw themselves slotted in the AP Poll on Jan. 24 at No. 24 for the program's first ranking in 15 years. Defensively, Ole Miss shattered program records with a season-high 142 blocks and held a record 10 opponents under 50 points, for the most in a single season.

Once SEC play hit, the Rebels did not cool off, picking up 10 conference wins for the second time in Ole Miss history. A 10-6 conference record pushed the Rebels into a fourth-place SEC finish for its best since 1994. With a double bye secured for the SEC Tournament in Nashville, Ole Miss knocked off No. 23 Florida to advance to its ninth semifinal appearance and first since 1993 before ultimately falling to top-seeded South Carolina. Just a little over a week later, jubilation occurred with Ole Miss seeing its name called on Selection Sunday for the first time since 2007 as a seven seed.

Under her tutelage, Shakira Austin earned First Team All-SEC honors for the second straight season, and garnered national acclaim as one of the best centers throughout Division I hoops. Bringing in transfer guard Angel Baker from Wright State proved to be key, as she went on to be named the SEC's Sixth-Woman of the Year, for the first in Ole Miss history.

McPhee-McCuin made history of her own after the 2021-22 campaign, becoming the first woman in Bahamian history to coach at the men's national level.



She served as an assistant with the Bahamas Men's Senior National Team during World Cup qualifiers.

Ole Miss bounced back from an 0-16 SEC season in 2019-20 to a 15-12 (4-10 SEC) campaign in 2020-21 that saw the Rebels come dangerously close to crashing the Big Dance. The Rebels knocked off three top-25 teams in the span of a month -- including a season-sweep of nationally ranked Kentucky and a momentous upset of No. 13 Arkansas in the First Round of the SEC Tournament to mark the first SEC Quarterfinal appearance for Ole Miss since 2010. The Rebels nearly knocked off No. 14 Tennessee in that quarterfinal, which would have marked the first SEC Semifinal appearance since 1993 and likely would have pushed the Rebels into the NCAA Tournament.

The Rebels were on the outside looking in on the Big Dance despite ending the regular season with a NET of 43, five NET top 100 wins, four NET top-50 wins, and a brutal final stretch that included going 4-4 in their last eight games against an average NET of 16.8. But Coach Yo and Ole Miss took that chip on their shoulder into the WNIT with a fury, advancing all the way to the championship game after playing superb team basketball -- the deepest postseason run in program history regardless of tournament. Ole Miss fell to a dominant Rice squad in that title game, but that could do little to dampen the spirits of a program with its sights set on even higher bars in the years to come.

Much of the success for the Rebels in 2020-21 came in the form of Honorable Mention All-American and First-Team All-SEC member Shakira Austin, who immediately asserted herself as one of the most feared players in the SEC and the nation after transferring to Ole Miss from Maryland in the offseason. Austin was the first First-Team selection for Ole Miss since 2014-15 and ended up on the Lisa Leslie Top-10 list, but she wasn't alone. Ole Miss' highly-touted top-ranked recruiting class from 2019 lived up to the hype in their first season, with Madison Scott earning SEC Freshman of the Year honors and Snudda Collins being named alongside her on the SEC All-Freshman team.

The swift turnaround is even more impressive when taking stock of where the Rebels were when she took over. Coach Yo took the reigns of a Rebel program her first year in 2018-19 that had just four returners and willed it to outperform all the preseason polls that had picked Ole Miss

unanimously to finish last. The Rebels improved their SEC win total by two games from the year before, winning three conference contests — one of which was a thrilling 55-49 win at No. 16 Kentucky on Jan. 13, 2019. The win was the first over a ranked team on the road for Ole Miss since 2011 and the first win in general in Lexington since 2007.

McPhee-McCuin also mentored graduate transfer Crystal Allen, who in her lone season donning a Rebel jersey became one of the most electrifying players in the SEC. Allen finished the season third in the conference at 18.3 PPG and was named second-team All-SEC – the first Rebel to earn All-SEC honors since 2014-15.

She followed that up by signing the SEC's top-ranked recruiting class in 2019-20, which included two five-star signees and the first McDonald's All-American in Ole Miss women's basketball history in Madison Scott.

Coach Yo was named the Rebels' ninth head coach on April 4, 2018, the first black female head coach in Ole Miss women's basketball history.

McPhee-McCuin spent the previous five seasons transforming Jacksonville into a perennial power in the Atlantic Sun Conference. During her tenure as head coach, McPhee-McCuin led the Dolphins to a 94-63 record (50-24 in ASUN play) and postseason appearances in each of her last three seasons.

McPhee-McCuin, who has also served as the national team head coach for her native Bahamas, took over a program at Jacksonville that had only won 20 or more games in a season twice in its entire history and proceeded to march the Dolphins to three-straight 20-win campaigns in her final three years.

In 2015-16, McPhee-McCuin and the Dolphins made history, capturing the program's first ASUN Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth with an upset in the conference championship game over two-time defending champion Florida Gulf Coast. The victory snapped FGCU's seven-year, 71-game home streak against ASUN opponents and boosted Jacksonville to a 22-11 record.

McPhee-McCuin's team followed that up with two more 20-win seasons and the first two WNIT appearances in JU history in 2016-17 (23-9, 11-3 ASUN) and 2017-18 (24-9, 12-2) with the final season seeing the Dolphins break the school record for single-season wins. In 2016-17,

Jacksonville was the lone ASUN program to receive votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll and earned the first WNIT at-large ever given to an ASUN team.

Prior to her time at Jacksonville, McPhee-McCuin was an assistant at Clemson from 2011-13, where she was recognized as one of the top assistants in the nation by National Women's Basketball Insider. While with the Tigers, McPhee-McCuin solidified her reputation as one of the best recruiters in the country, spearheading the No. 16 class in the nation in her final year at Clemson, which included five McDonalds All-America nominees.

Before her stint at Clemson, McPhee-McCuin was on staff at Pittsburgh for two seasons in 2009 and 2010. She was part of a pair of postseason appearances with the Panthers, who rose to No. 14 in the national rankings and advanced to a Sweet 16.

Her coaching career also includes stops at Portland, Frank Phillips College, and Arkansas-Pine Bluff, where she earned her master's degree in physical education with a perfect 4.0 GPA as a student-athlete.

McPhee-McCuin received her bachelor's in business management and administration from Rhode Island in 2004, playing in 56 games over her junior and senior years at URI and helping the Rams advance to the 2003 A-10 title game. She played her first two seasons at Miami-Dade Community College.

McPhee-McGuin was the first Bahamian woman to sign a Division I letter of intent to play basketball, becoming a trailblazer in the process for other aspiring athletes from her home country. She is the first Bahamian woman to coach at a Division I program and was the first black female head coach at Jacksonville.

McPhee-McCuin is also part of two Halls of Fame across both her playing and coaching career. In 2016, she was inducted into the Bahamian Athletic Hall of Fame alongside Buddy Hield (of the NBA's Sacramento Kings) and Jonquel Jones (of the WNBA's Connecticut Sun). In 2013, she was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame and was one of 10 recipients of the Pathfinder Award for their distinguished achievement outside of New England.

Born April 30, 1982, the former Yolett McPhee and her husband, Kelly McCuin, have two daughters: Yasmine and Yuri.

SERIES HISTORY

Ole Miss and Notre Dame are facing off for just the second time in the series history, but the second time in two years. The Rebels and Fighting Irish last faced off in the second round of the 2023-24 NCAA Tournament, with Notre Dame claiming a 71-56 win as the host team.

In that game, Madison Scott and Kennedy Todd-Williams combined for 30 points and 10 rebounds, but it wasn't enough as the Fighting Irish shot 50 percent from the field, including 44.4 percent from beyond the arc.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

Head coach Niele Ivey is in her sixth season at the helm of her alma mater and has revitalized the program into a perennial powerhouse. With a career record of 122-39, Ivey has guided the Fighting Irish to four consecutive trips to the Sweet 16 and an ACC Tournament title. Ivey and the Fighting Irish have continued that upward trajectory to start 2025-26, opening the season with a 5-1 record. Notre Dame's only loss this season has come from now No. 6 Michigan.

Last season, Notre Dame went 28-6 and earned a share of the ACC regular season title for the second time in three years. The Fighting Irish downed three AP Top 5 teams in the same season for the first time in program history. One of Ivey's crown jewels is junior guard Hannah Hidalgo out of Merchantville, New Jersey. Hidalgo has been one of the best players in the country and is an established offensive threat from all areas of the court. Hidalgo has averaged at least 20 points per game in each of her seasons with the Fighting Irish and enters Thursday's matchup against the Rebels averaging 27.0 points in six games. Hidalgo is also a defensive menace, averaging over six steals a game to start this season.

The Fighting Irish boast one of the most experienced teams in all of NCAA women's basketball this season. Ten members of the team are upperclassmen, five of which are graduates. Two seniors who have entered the conversation as strong second and third options behind Hidalgo are KK Bransford and Cassandre Prosper. Both guards are averaging north of 10 points per game, while Bransford leads the team in rebounds at 6.8 per contest.

Rounding out the starting five for the Notre Dame is Vanessa De Jesus and Gisela Sanchez. De Jesus has established herself alongside Hidalgo as one of the best 3-point shooters on the team while Sanchez' 6-foot-4 stature is the tallest on the team. The aforementioned five athletes have been Notre Dame's staple to start each game this season.

GAMES AGAINST THE ACC

The Rebels are 16-21 against all members in the ACC during their 51-year history. Ole Miss has most frequently played Miami, playing the Hurricane seven times. Ole Miss has beaten Miami and Florida State the most among ACC opponents, claiming three wins each.

Ole Miss faced two members of the ACC last season, besting Boston College but falling to NC State. Ole Miss dominated Boston College in the first round of the Continental Tire Baha Mar Championship, 92-55, as five Rebels reached double-digit scoring. It was Ole Miss' first victory against an ACC opponent since beating Georgia Tech, 63-48, on March 22, 2015.

In last season's edition of the SEC/ACC Challenge, the Rebels narrowly fell to the Wolfpack, 68-62. The Rebels are looking for their first victory in the challenge on their third attempt. In the inaugural SEC/ACC Challenge game, Ole Miss fell to No. 22 Louisville, 64-58

THE EXPECTATION, NOT THE EXCEPTION

Entering year eight of the Yolett McPhee-McCuin era in Oxford, the standard has been set. Two Sweet 16s in three years, four NCAA Tournaments in a row, four straight 10-win SEC seasons, multiple All-SEC selections and three WNBA Draft picks, the Rebels have re-asserted themselves as a top program in women's college basketball.

TELL A FRIEND TO TELL A FRIEND, WE'RE BACK!

Entering the 2025-26 season, three key players from last year's squad are poised to provide leadership for the nine newcomers. Returning starters in Christeen Iwuala and Sira Thienou are primed to showcase their development from the off-season, while J'Adore Young is ready to return to the court after medically redshirting last season.

- Appeared in all 33 games in 2024-25 while starting in six
- Had at least five rebounds 17 times while leading the team in the category nine times last season
- Averaged 6.8 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a Rebel

Sira Thienou

- Appeared in all 33 games during 2024-25 season with 22 starts
- Named to the SEC All-Freshman Team, earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors twice, becoming the first Rebel since Madison Scott to earn that honor multiple times in a season
- Recorded 79 steals, the second-most by an Ole Miss freshman in program history

J'Adore Young

- Did not play in any games and redshirted the 2024-25 season
- Appeared off the bench in seven games for the Rebels in 2023-24

PORTAL POWERHOUSE

Branding herself as the portal queen, when players decide to transfer, Coach Yo loves to prove that a home for them is available in Oxford. Preaching the importance of development, players who decide to come to Ole Miss can see their game taken to a new level. Bringing in eight players from the transfer portal this offseason, the Rebels have been recognized as having the second-best transfer class, according to ESPN.

- Spent one season at Mississippi State prior to entering the transfer portal, where she played and started in all 34 games
- Spent two seasons at UAB, where she was named to the 2024 American Athletic Conference All-Conference Third Team and the 2023 Conference USA All-Freshman Team

Desrae Kyles

- Spent two seasons at Central Michigan prior to entering the transfer portal, where she redshirted the 2024-25 season

- Spent one season at Virginia prior to entering the transfer portal, where she averaged 14.3 points and led the team with 8.2 rebounds per game

GIVE ME THE NUMBERS

The 2025-26 Ole Miss basketball roster boasts some serious career statistics. Combined this season's Rebel roster has 495 career DI starts, 15 all-conference selections and eight combined Sweet 16 appearances. Collectively, the team possesses 7,461 career points, 2,597 rebounds, 1,209 assists, 760 steals and 370 blocks.

Individually, Denim DeShields, Cotie McMahon and Kaitlin Peterson have each accrued over 1,000 points thus far in their career. Ole Miss is the only NCAA DI women's basketball program in the country to bring in a trio of players via the transfer portal who've reached the century mark in points.

RANKED REBELS

Garnering national recognition in the polls, the Rebels recently came in at No. 13 in the AP, marking the highest ranking following four weeks of play since Dec. 17, 1990 when the Rebels were at No. 11. Additionally, the Rebels came in at No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, marking the best week four ranking since Dec 19, 1990 where Ole Miss was picked at No. 11.

IT JUST MEANS MORE

In both the SEC media and coaches' poll, Ole Miss has been selected to finish sixth overall out of the 16 teams in the SEC. This marks the fourth consecutive year that Ole Miss has received top-six preseason recognition after earning a No. 4 selection in 2023, and No. 5 selections in 2024 and 2022. The Rebels have surpassed expectations four times in the last five years, ending the season higher in the standings than voted on in the SEC Preseason Media Poll. Additionally, both polls placed Cotie McMahon on the Preseason All-SEC Second Team.

HOME SWEET HOME

Rebel nation has turned the SJB Pavilion into an intimidating environment for visiting teams, especially in the nonconference slate. Ole Miss has won 34 of its last 37 games at home against nonconference opponents, dating back to the 2020 season. During the 2024-25 season, the Rebels won all seven nonconference games at the SJB Pavilion, the third time Ole Miss has entered conference competition undefeated at home under Coach Yo. The Rebels aim to build on that success with the six more nonconference matchups on their home court this year.

STEALIN' SIRA

Last season, Sira Thienou led the Rebels in pickpocketing balls, earning the most steals per game by any freshman in a power four conference, while also sitting fourth in the SEC and 42nd in the nation with 2.4 steals a game. In conference play, Thienou recorded 47 steals for an average of 2.9 per game. The Bamako, Mali, native will look to elevate her defensive presense this season to match Coach Yo's defensive philosophy.

GIVE

Every season, head coach Yolett McPhee-McCuin selects a word for her team to live by, one that embodies their purpose and guides their mindset. This year, that word is "Give." Coach Yo believes true leadership begins with service, and in today's college athletics landscape, where student-athletes receive so much, she emphasizes the importance of giving back. Her goal is to prepare her players not only for success on the court, but also for life beyond basketball, where fulfillment often comes through what you give, not just what you get. Ultimately, Coach Yo challenges her team to give their all not just in competition, but also in the classroom and to one another.

BUILDING BEYOND SCOTT

Madison Scott had an outstanding five-year career at Ole Miss, consistently elevating her game and becoming one of the most exciting players in the SEC. Nationally recognized for her talent, Scott earned a spot on the 2025 All-SEC Second Team, marking her seventh career conference honor, and was recognized as a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American. Additionally, she was awarded the 2025 Gillom Trophy as the best women's basketball player in Mississippi.

Her eye-popping play led her to earn an invite to the WNBA Draft in New York City, where she was ultimately selected with the 14th pick in the second round by the Dallas Wings, but she now currently plays with the Washington Mystics. Coach Yo and the Rebels will have to navigate the season without the steady leadership and veteran presence of Scott, whose impact on and off the court set the tone for Ole Miss the past half-decade.

HISTORY REWRITTEN

Last year, Ole Miss reached the 20-win plateau for a fourth consecutive season and the 22nd time in program history. It marked the first time in the 21st century that Ole Miss has reached at least 20 wins in four straight seasons and first since Van Chancellor led 11 consecutive teams to that mark from 1981-92. Additionally, the Rebels have tallied at least 10 SEC wins in the last four seasons. Coach Yo is the only coach in program history to have at least 20 overall wins and 10 SEC wins in four seasons at the helm.

Starting off the year a perfect 5-0, Ole Miss went undefeated through the full month of November for the first time since the 2008-09 season, averaging an impressive scoring margin of +30.6. Additionally, the Rebels are undefeated through seven games for the first time since 2008-09, the first time in head coach Yolett McPhee-McCuin's tenure at the helm. It's only the third time since the 2000-01 season that Ole Miss has begun a season this hot and 13th time ever in the program's 51 years of history.

Christeen Iwuala has established herself as one of the top frontcourt players in the SEC throughout the nonconference season. She has recorded a double-double in three of her past five outings, after previously never earning the feat in any of her three seasons of collegiate basketball prior. Iwuala has led the Rebels in scoring four times and grabbed the most rebounds five times this year, leading Ole Miss in both categories. She is following the pattern that Rebel transfers under Coach Yo tend to blossom in their second year in Oxford, joining the likes of Marquesha Davis, Angel Baker and Shakira Austin.

In the first game of the 2025-26 season, the Rebels put on a clinic from long distance, draining 13 threes on a 43.3 percent shooting clip. It surpasses last season's single game best by three and serves as the most since the Rebels clicked on 14 on Dec. 28, 2018, against North Florida. In the first quarter alone, Ole Miss converted five 3-pointers, matching last season's average in threes made per an entire game.

Cotie McMahon paced the team in made threes with four on six attempts (66.7%), followed by Tianna Thompson who made three on four attempts (75.0%). Alongside the leading pair, Debreasha Powe and Sira Thienou each earned two buckets from behind the arc, while Latasha Lattimore and Denim DeShields rounded out the Rebels' 3-point frenzy with one apiece.

Down 13 points late in the third quarter against Memphis, Ole Miss showed its resilience and fought all the way back to force extra minutes. Once in overtime, it was all Rebels, allowing Ole Miss to win their first overtime game since Feb. 18, 2024, when they beat Mississippi State in Oxford, 75-71. Ole Miss has won the last four of its games that have been forced into overtime, dating back to the 2022-23 season. Additionally, Yolett McPhee-McCuin is now 5-4 in overtime games as the Rebels head coach.

Scoring 102 points against Longwood, Ole Miss dropped triple-digit scoring for the first time since Dec. 8, 2020, when they scored 104 against Alcorn State at home. It's the second time under head coach Yolett McPhee-McCuin that Ole Miss has scored at least 100 points and the 36th time ever in program history.

After her impressive showing at the Coast 2 Coast Classic, Christeen Iwuala was one of five student-athletes that were named to the All-Tournament First Team. In just this week alone, she led the SEC in rebounds with 26 and in field goals with 22, while also ranking third in most points in the conference at 55. Earning 21 points and 10 rebounds in the second game of the weekend against George Mason, Iwuala earned her third double-double of her career. She narrowly missed having another double-double in the first game against Wisconsin, falling just two rebounds short after earning 20 points and eight rebounds.
