#### THE OPENING TIP

- Duke puts its five-game win streak to the test Sunday, Jan. 4 against No. 16 Notre Dame. The Blue Devils are 8-6 overall, 3-0 in league action with their last loss coming Dec. 4 against LSU . Each of the past five wins have come by at least 15 points with the average margin of victory being 32 points.
- Duke's six losses are against the current NET No. 5 LSU, No. 4 UCLA, No. 2 South Carolina, No. 18 West Virginia, No. 34 Baylor and No. 80 South Florida. The Blue Devils are led on offense by sophomore Toby Fournier's 17.5 points per game. Ashlon Jackson is dropping 12.1 points per game and Taina Mair follows with an average of 11.8 to round out the double-digit scorers. Fournier and Delaney Thomas lead the charge on the glass, averaging 7.4 and 5.9 rebounds per game, respectively. Fournier is the top rim protector, averaging 2.4 blocks per game, while Jordan Wood is at 1.3 per game. Mair is the floor general, dishing 5.1 assists to 2.6 turnovers per game.
- Notre Dame comes to Durham following a tough overtime loss at Georgia Tech Thursday. The 18th-ranked Fighting Irish are 10-3 overall and 2-1 in the ACC. Hannah Hidalgo and Cassandre Prosper are their scorers, averaging 25.5 and 16.5 points per game, respectively. Hidalgo is also pulling down 6.1 rebounds per game and averages 6.1 steals per game while shooting 49 percent from the floor. Prosper is hitting 55 percent from the field and leads all rebounders at 7.1 per game. The Irish average 86.2 points per game and force 23.5 turnovers per game.
- Duke looks to pick up its first ranked win of the year Sunday. The Blue Devils are 5-19 all-time against Notre Dame but own the most recent win - 61-56 in the 2025 ACC Championship Semifinal. The Irish are 5-3 inside Cameron Indoor Stadium overall and 2-3 against a Kara Lawson coached Duke squad. Of the past five meetings between the schools, three have been decided by five or fewer points and four of the five by single digits.

AFTER 14 GAMES

- Duke is 8-6 overall and back home for its ACC home opener. The Blue Devils are 3-0 in league action. Sophomore Toby Fournier headlines the offense, averaging 17.5 points per game and 7.4 rebounds per game. She has registered double digits in 13 of her 14 games and has put together five consecutive outings with at least 18 points. Ashlon Jackson is chipping in 12.1 points per game, while Taina Mair is averaging 11.8, including a season-high 22 points against South Dakota State. Mair is the quarterback of the offense, adding 5.2 assists and 5.1 rebounds per game and a team-best 32 steals. Delaney Thomas has been a consistent presence, averaging 9.3 points and shooting at least 50 percent in 13 of 14 games. She also grabs 5.9 rebounds per game and helps lead Duke's defense with 25 steals.
- Duke is coming off its best shooting performance of the season and is hitting 43 percent of its shots.

LAWSON VERSUS TOP 25 OPPONENTS

- Duke will face a top-25 opponent for the fifth time this season and the 53rd time since head coach Kara Lawson took the reins during the 2020-21 season. The Blue Devils' last ranked win was against North Carolina in the Sweet Sixteen last season.
- Duke is 0-14 versus top-five opponents under Lawson and 20-32 overall against top-25 competition since the 2020-21 campaign. The Blue Devils have fared well against Nos. 6-10, going 10-4. When unranked, Duke is 7-16 versus ranked foes.
- Duke is 8-9 in top-25 matchups inside Cameron Indoor Stadium under Lawson.

NUMBERS BEHIND THE WIN STREAK

- The Blue Devils have won five straight as they inch closer to 10 wins. Duke is averaging 82.8 points per game, has a +32.0 scoring margin and has shot 47.5 percent in the five-game stretch. On the glass, Duke sports a +14.6 rebounding margin, compared to just +8.0 in November non-conference games against unranked opponents.
- Defensively, the Blue Devils are holding opponents to just 50.8 points per game, 32.6 percent shooting and only 21 percent from distance.

INDIVIDUAL NUMBERS INSIDE THE WIN STREAK

- Toby Fournier has shined for the Blue Devils during the four-game win streak, averaging 21.0 points and 9.8 rebounds per game. She has done well to stay out of foul trouble, committing just seven fouls, while blocking 13 shots in that span.
- Overall, Duke has four players averaging double digits over the four games. Three players are averaging at least three assists per game during the win streak, including Riley Nelson who has upped her assist average from 1.6 to 3.6. Ashlon Jackson is dropping 5.4 dimes per game compared to 3.6 in the unranked November contests.

BREAKING DOWN THE NET RANKINGS

- The first edition of the NET rankings was released Dec. 1, with Duke coming in at No. 49. As of Jan. 1, Duke was ranked No. 24, with its NET strength of schedule sitting at sixth. Notre Dame is No. 25 in the NET with a SOS of 61.
- Duke has faced six Q1 teams, going 1-5 in those games. The six are tied for the second most among Power 5 programs. Duke is 2-1 against Q2 teams, 1-0 versus the Q3 and 4-0 against Q4.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME/SERIES HISTORY

- Duke and Notre Dame are meeting for the 25th time overall. The Fighting Irish hold a commanding 19-5 advantage in the series, but the Blue Devils own the most recent win at the 2025 ACC Championship semifinal. Duke is 3-2 against the Irish under head coach Kara Lawson and four of the five matchups have been decided by single digits.
- Coming off its first ACC loss and the first setback since Dec. 4, the Irish are 10-3 overall and 2-1 in league action. Notre Dame is 2-2 on the road and is 1-2 against Q1 teams in the NET rankings. Hannah Hidalgo is the undisputed leader on both ends of the court, leading the country with 6.08 steals per game and ranking second nationally with 25.5 points per game. She has scored at least 20 points in 10 of the 13 games and is credited with five-plus steals in seven outings. Former Blue Devil Vanessa de Jesus averages 10.7 points and 4.3 assists in 33 minutes per game. Cassandre Prosper is contributing 16.5 points per game and is the team's top rebounder at 7.1 per outing. The Fighting Irish average 86.2 points per game and are shooting 48 percent for the year to rank 14th in the country.

IT'S A ONGOING BLOCK PARTY

- Featuring nine players standing 6-0 or taller, and five Blue Devils at 6-2 or taller, Duke is long and athletic and wreaks havoc defensively on the perimeter and around the rim. The statistics reflect that with Duke ranking second in the ACC and 11th nationally in blocks per game (6.4).
- Duke recorded an impressive 14 blocks against Baylor - tied for sixth in program history and the most since the 16 against Winthrop in 2016.
- The Blue Devils' 89 total blocks are also 11th in the country. The 14 denials against Baylor are tied for the second most in a game by a Division I team this season.
- Duke has double-digit blocks in two games this season. In the 138 games under Lawson prior to the 2025-26 campaign, the Blue Devils had just five games with 10-plus denials.

THE BLOCK PARTY HOSTESSES

- Toby Fournier (2.43/gm), Jordan Wood (1.31/gm) and Arianna Roberson (1.18) are the hostesses of the party, ranking second, 11th and 13th in the league in blocking average, respectively. The Blue Devils are the only team in the ACC to have two players with at least 17 blocks.
- Fournier's 34 blocks in 14 games this season are just five shy of her total of 39 in 35 games last season. She has tallied four blocks in four games and multiple blocks in 10 outings already this season. Fournier had 11 multiple-block games last year.



MARATHON MAIR AND JACKSON

- Seniors Taina Mair and Ashlon Jackson have been marathon women for the Blue Devils this season, averaging 33.1 and 33.0 minutes per game to rank third and fourth in the ACC, respectively. Duke and Notre Dame are the lone programs to have players averaging at least 33.0 minutes per game.
- Mair has played 35-plus minutes in seven of the 14 games. In her previous 71 games at Duke, Mair played 35 or more minutes just eight times.
- Jackson has spent 35-plus minutes on the floor in seven games this season. Coming into the 2025-26 campaign, Jackson had played more than 35 minutes in 14 of her 103 contests.
- The last Duke player to average at least 33 minutes per game was Haley Gorecki during the 2019-20 season - playing an astounding 36.2 minutes per game.

DELANEY THE STEADY EDDY

- Junior Delaney Thomas is a consistent force for the Blue Devils and can be counted on for a solid six to 10 points per game. Averaging 6.6 points per game for her career, Thomas is steady on the offensive end, shooting at least 50 percent in 49 of her 84 career games. She owns 25 double-digit scoring games, seven of which have come in the past 10 games. She is averaging 9.3 points per game this season, up 2.2 from last season and an increase of 4.3 from her rookie campaign.
- On the defensive end of the floor, Thomas averages 4.4 rebounds per game for her career and has collected five-plus rebounds in 33 contests. She is second on the team this season, averaging 5.9 rebounds per game and helps anchor the defense with 25 steals and a team-high four drawn charges.

ALL ABOUT ARI

- After missing 440 days due to injury, Arianna Roberson is back on the court. The redshirt freshman is third on the team in rebounding (5.6). Roberson has scored at least three points in each of her 11 games and has at least one block in eight of the 11. She had her best defensive game of the season at Syracuse, pulling down a career-high 12 rebounds and blocking three shots. She followed that with a career-high 14 points against Boston College.
- Arianna comes from a family of accomplished athletes. Her parents, John (basketball) and Lisa (volleyball), were athletes at New Mexico State. Arianna is the youngest of seven - Ashlee (basketball at Texas Tech, 2007-10), Amber (volleyball at Texas, 2008-11), André (7 seasons in NBA), Arielle (basketball at Colorado, 2012-15, and WVU, 2015-16), Anthony (Central Oklahoma and for Thunder G League) and Aaliyah (women's basketball senior at TCU).

FOURNIER GETTING TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Able to post up and score, beat her defender off the dribble or pull up for a three, sophomore forward Toby Fournier is a triple threat, meaning she is the most fouled player in the ACC. She leads the conference and ranks third nationally in free throws taken at 102. Only two players in the ACC have attempted 70-plus free throws this season.
- Despite hitting just 52.0 percent of her freebies, Fournier ranks fourth in the ACC with 53 makes. In her rookie season, Fournier averaged 4.8 free throws per game. One year later, she is going to the line 7.3 times per game.

SHARING IS CARING

- Duke has done a good job of sharing the ball this season, averaging 16.9 assists per game to rank sixth in the ACC. The Blue Devils have 237 assists on 382 field goals for a 62-percent assist-to-field-goal ratio. Senior guards Taina Mair and Ashlon Jackson have been the most generous, dishing 72 and 57 helpers, respectively. They are responsible for 54 percent of Duke's assists through 14 games - 19 percent higher than the 2024-25 season (212 of 610 team assists).

JA"D"YN DONOVAN

- Speaking of blocks and defense, junior Jadyn Donovan is one of the leaders to Duke's defense with the ability to guard all five positions. The Upper Marlboro, Maryland, native suffocates guards on the perimeter and then drops down low, blocking and changing shots.
- Donovan is fourth on the team in blocks despite spending more than half her time defending the perimeter. She is third in steals (14) for the Blue Devils while ranking sixth in minutes played among the eight full-time players.

ASHLON JACKSON FINDS WAYS TO IMPACT THE GAME

- Ashlon Jackson might not be shooting as well as she'd like (34% overall and 29% from three), but she continues to have an incredible impact in other ways. The senior captain has increased her assist production by 95 percent from last season and is averaging six per game over the past four outings.
- Defensively, she has increased her rebounding average by 33 percent and has four five-plus rebound games - one more than she had in 37 games last year.
- Jackson got off to a slow start, going 12-of-44 (27.2%) in the first seven games. She has gotten into a better rhythm, knocking down 17-of-55 (30.9) in the past seven, including going 3-of-7 in the most recent outing.
- She has 191 trifectas for her career, sitting fifth in Duke history. She needs just nine more threes to become just the fifth player in Duke lore to reach 200. Her 538 attempts are fourth.

ASHLON JACKSON'S CAREER ARC ON THE COURT

- Senior leader Ashlon Jackson has taken big strides throughout her time under Kara Lawson's tutelage. As a freshman, Jackson came off the bench and averaged just 13.3 minutes per game and shot .315 from the floor. Three years later, Jackson joined the 1,000-point club in perfect fashion, draining a three-pointer against South Dakota State.
- The China, Texas, native took a leap forward in her sophomore year, starting all 33 games and averaging 29.2

ASHLON JACKSON'S CAREER ARC OFF THE COURT

- While Jackson's excellence on the court is impressive, perhaps more amazing is that the Blue Devil guard graduated from Duke in three years and is now pursuing her master's degree in her final year of athletic eligibility.
- Jackson graduated with a degree in sociology in May, 2025. She is in the middle of completing her Master of Arts in Liberal Studies (MALS) at Duke, giving her two Duke degrees in May.

"TANKING" CARE OF THE BALL

- Senior point guard Taina Mair has been excellent for the Blue Devils throughout her time quarterbacking the team in Durham. In her two-plus seasons as Duke's point guard, the Blue Devils are 59-26. For her career, Mair is 75-43 as a point guard.
- Year three in Durham so far has been the best for Mair, with 72 assists and 37 turnovers after 14 games. She is eighth in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.95) and fifth in assists per game (5.1).

- The Boston native has improved her consistency each season at Duke and finished the 2024-25 campaign seventh in the ACC with an A/TO ratio of 1.81.

MAIR DOES IT ALL

- Mair has done it all this season for the Blue Devils. She has scored double-digits in eight of the 14 games, collected at least five rebounds in nine contests and picked up three-plus steals six times. The Boston native's 32 steals are seventh in the ACC. Mair has led Duke in points four times, rebounds three times, assists in eight games and steals five times.
- With 19 points and three assists at South Florida, Mair became the fifth player to reach 1,000 career points and 500 career assists while wearing a Blue Devil uniform. She is the sixth to hit 500 assists. Needing 33 rebounds to surpass 500, Mair would be just the third Duke player to finish her collegiate career at Duke with those three milestones.
- Mair currently is the lone guard in the ACC to have 1,000 points and 500 assists and ranks fifth among active players with 542 assists. She is on pace to become the fifth active player in Division I women's basketball to have the 1,000, 500, 500 trifecta.

MORE ABOUT MAIR

- Mair, a pass first guard in her previous two seasons with the Blue Devils, has been more aggressive on the offensive end this season and it's paying off for the Blue Devils and the senior point guard.
- Mair, averaging 11.8 points, 5.1 rebounds and 5.1 assists per game, has eight double-digit performances this season - only one fewer than the nine she had in 37 games last year. She has increased her averages from last season in virtually every statistical category.
- Mair and Hannah Hidalgo of Notre Dame are the lone players in the ACC to average at least 10 points, five rebounds and five assists per game this season. Hidalgo averages 25.5, 6.1 and 5.4, respectively.

RILEY NELSON IS SO BACK

- Redshirt sophomore Riley Nelson saw her first action as a Blue Devil against Baylor in Paris. It was the first game for the Clarksburg, Maryland, native in 659 days, dating back to Jan. 14, 2024, in a Maryland uniform.
- Nelson is starting to figure out the Duke offense, distributing 18 assists during the five-game win streak, 58 percent of her total of 31 this season. In the past five games, Nelson is averaging 13.2 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game with four double-digit outings, including a career-high 20 points against Boston College.

EMILEE RETURNS ON THE FLOOR

- Duke freshman Emilee Skinner returned to the court against Virginia Tech - her first game since Nov. 14. Playing just 13 minutes, Skinner had her most productive game as a Blue Devil, finishing with seven points, seven rebounds and one steal.
- Skinner made her collegiate debut Nov. 12 with five assists and four points in 13 minutes before being sidelined for the next five games.
- The rookie guard was the No. 4 recruit in the espnW 2025 class, finishing her scholastic career with 2,313 points - fourth most in Utah state history. She was the third girls basketball player from Utah to earn McDonald's All-America honors, joining Timea Gardiner (2022) and Lehi's Michelle (2006).

LOOKING AT THE LAWSON COACHING ARC

- Kara Lawson has launched Duke women's basketball back into the national spotlight, totaling 94 wins over the previous four seasons and increasing the wins total from her first complete season (2021-22) through the 2024-25 campaign by 71 percent. Of ACC coaches who have been at their respective schools for at least five years, Lawson is second in wins in the first four years at the helm and leads the way in overall percentage increase from year one to year four.

IT WAS A NON-STOP NOVEMBER

- Eight of the Blue Devils' non-conference matchups took place during the month of November. Duke played five games in 12 days - Nov. 9-20. The Blue Devils traveled to three different states Nov. 14-20 as the final six games of the month took place away from Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- Duke traveled nearly 1,800 miles from Nov. 13-20, making stops in West Virginia, Virginia and Florida during the eight-day span. The Blue Devils capped the month with a trip to Las Vegas, tacking on 4,600 more miles.
- Including the 8,100-mile round trip to Paris, the total mileage for the month of November was 14,500.

BRING IT ON!

- After finishing last season with the nation's No. 2 strength of schedule, the Blue Devils are once again set to face one of the nation's most daunting non-conference schedules ahead of ACC play.
- Nine of Duke's opponents competed in the 2025 NCAA Tournament, while six finished in the top 50 of the NCAA Evaluation Tool (NET) rankings: Baylor (Nov. 3), Norfolk State (Nov. 12), West Virginia (Nov. 14), Liberty (Nov. 16), South Florida (Nov. 20), South Carolina (Nov. 26), UCLA (Nov. 27), LSU (Dec. 4) and South Dakota State (Dec. 18).
- Overall, the Blue Devils will play four more games against current AP top-25 opponents, including two matchups against rival, No. 18 North Carolina.

- Duke women's basketball continues to command the national spotlight, leading all Power Four programs with the most nationally televised games this season.
- The Blue Devils are slated for national television 24 times during the regular season - four more than a year ago. Duke edged out South Carolina (23), North Carolina (22), Iowa (20), NC State (20) and UCLA (20) to claim the top spot among Power Four programs.
- The only team with more national TV appearances than Duke this season is UConn, with 31.
- Duke will appear on the ESPN family of networks 21 times. The confirmed slate includes seven games on ESPN or ESPN2, 10 contests on ACC Network, two on ESPNU and one on ABC. Duke's game against Notre Dame (Jan. 4) will air on ACC Network.

THE NEXT GENERATION OF THE SISTERHOOD

- Duke wrapped up the November signing period with four additions to The Sisterhood. Autumn Fleary (12), Bella Flemings (16), Sanai Green (25) and Taylor Soflikanich (43) each possess incredible basketball and academic resumes.
- Fleary headlines the class as a 5-7 point guard from Sidwell Friends, while Bella Flemings comes to Durham as a 6-0

combo guard out of San Antonio for SA Finest on the AAU circuit.

- Sainai Green is a 6-0 wing from Long Island Lutheran who averaged 20.1 points per game over her previous three seasons.
- Soflikanich is a 6-5 center from New Jersey. She heads into her senior season after scoring 271 points and pulling down 183 rebounds as a junior.

USA! USA! USA! LAWSON NAMED USA BASKETBALL WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM HEAD COACH

- Three-time Olympic champion Kara Lawson was named head coach of USA Basketball's Women's National Team Sept. 22, 2025.
- Lawson, who has earned 13 combined gold medals as a player and coach with USA Basketball, will lead the U.S. women at the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup (Berlin) and at the 2028 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Additionally, she will coach at qualifying tournaments, training camps and exhibitions throughout the Olympic cycle.
- This past summer, Lawson served as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile, leading the Americans to a 7-0 record and the gold medal.

SUMMER OF GOLD

- Duke women's basketball shined on the international stage during the summer of 2025, as four current or former Blue Devils helped lead their respective teams to gold medals in FIBA competition.
- Head coach Kara Lawson guided the U.S. Women's National Team to gold at the 2025 FIBA Women's AmeriCup, defeating Brazil 92-84 in the championship game. The triumph gave the United States its fifth FIBA Women's AmeriCup title.
- Emilee Skinner captured gold at the FIBA U19 Women's World Cup - the fourth straight for the United States - by way of an 88-76 victory over Australia.
- Miela (Goodchild) Sowah and the Australian Opals secured their first FIBA Women's Asia Cup title after dispatching Japan, 88-79.
- Elizabeth Balogun rounded out the quartet, aiding the Nigerian Women's National Team to the 2025 FIBA Women's AfroBasket championship with a 78-64 triumph over Mali in the title game. Nigeria pushed its win streak to 29 games and captured an unprecedented fifth consecutive FIBA Women's AfroBasket championship - the first team to achieve the feat.
- Following their victories, Balogun, Lawson and Sowah earned automatic bids to the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Berlin.

UP NEXT

- The Blue Devils head to the West Coast for matchups at Cal and Stanford the following week. Duke takes on the Golden Bears Jan. 8 at 6 p.m. (ET) and the Cardinal Jan. 11 at 5 p.m. (ET).

### BIO SNAPSHOT

Former WNBA and three-time Olympic Champion Kara Lawson was named Duke University's sixth women's basketball head coach on July 11th, 2020. Lawson enters her sixth season at the helm in 2025-26. Through five seasons at Duke, Lawson has led the resurgence of Duke women's basketball, elevating the Blue Devils into one of the nation's most elite teams. She has compiled a 97-41 (.703) overall record and is just three wins away from reaching 100 career victories. This past year, Lawson guided Duke to its most successful season since 2012-13 as the Blue Devils went 29-8 overall, captured the 2025 ACC Championship and advanced to their 12th NCAA Elite Eight.

An icon in women's college basketball, Lawson's impact on the women's hoops community is evident. Lawson brought her decorated basketball career, both on and off the court, to the Blue Devils after spending the 2020 season as an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. She was the franchise's first female coach in its 73-year history.

Additionally, Lawson's playing career has her in a league of her own as she is currently the only active NCAA Division I women's basketball coach to play in an NCAA Final Four, win a WNBA Championship and win an Olympic Gold Medal.

On Sept. 22, 2025, Lawson was named head coach of the USA Basketball Women's National Team through 2028. She was selected by USA Basketball's Women's National Team managing director Sue Bird and was approved by the USA Basketball Board of Directors. In this role, Lawson will lead the USA women at the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Berlin and at the 2028 Olympics Games in Los Angeles, in addition to coaching at qualifying tournaments, training camps and exhibitions throughout the Olympic cycle.

Lawson holds extensive experience with USA Basketball, racking up 13 career gold medals across her playing and coaching career with the organization. During the summer of 2025, Lawson served as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team at the FIBA Women's AmeriCup in Santiago, Chile, where she led Team USA to an unblemished 7-0 record and the gold medal. Prior to that, she was an assistant coach for Team USA at the 2024 Paris Olympics and 2022 FIBA Women's World Cup (Sydney, Australia), aiding the United States to gold medals at both events. Since 2017, Lawson has helped lead USA Basketball women's 3x3 teams to seven gold medals, including the USA's 3x3 Women's National Team in its Olympic debut at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. She is one of only three women in Olympic basketball history to win gold as both a player and head coach.

In 13 WNBA seasons, Lawson averaged 9.8 points, 2.6 rebounds, and 2.5 assists in 377 career games with the Sacramento Monarchs, Connecticut Sun and Washington Mystics from 2003 to 2015. She surpassed 3,000 points, 800 rebounds and 700 assists in the WNBA. Lawson was the No. 5 overall selection by the Detroit Shock in the 2003 WNBA Draft. In addition to her WNBA career, which included winning a WNBA championship with the Monarchs in 2005 as well as an All-Star appearance in 2007, Lawson was a member of the Team USA roster that captured the gold medal at the 2008 Summer Olympic Games in Beijing.

A four-time All-SEC selection and two-time All-America at Tennessee, Lawson played for the late Pat Summitt where she led the Lady Vols to four straight SEC regular season and tournament crowns and three NCAA Final Four appearances (2000, 2002, 2003) during her collegiate career. Lawson appeared in 143 games, making 137 starts, and helped Tennessee to a 126-17 overall and 54-2 mark in the SEC over her four seasons.

Following an exceptional playing career, Lawson spent 17 years as a broadcaster, game and studio analyst for the Washington Wizards with NBC Sports Washington, as well as for men's and women's college basketball and the NBA with ESPN. On January 12th, 2007, she became the first female analyst for a nationally televised NBA game when the New Orleans Hornets squared off against the Washington Wizards. Lawson also served as a color announcer during the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo with NBC.
