Orange Versus Irish At The Dome

Syracuse completes the January portion of its schedule with a matchup against Notre Dame in the JMA Wireless Dome on Saturday.

Syracuse-Notre Dame Series

- ✓ Syracuse leads the all-time series, 35-24.
- ✓ The Orange have won six-of-the-last eight against the Irish.
- ✓ Syracuse and Notre Dame first met in the 1913-14 campaign.
- ✓ The two programs have shared residency in the BIG EAST Conference and the ACC.

Syracuse Notes

- ✓ SU is 9-4 in the Dome this season.
- ✓ Sophomore forward **Donnie Freeman** has scored in double digits in all 12 of his games and has topped 20 points six times.
- ✓ Senior center **William Kyle III** is tied for third among Division I players in blocks (57) and blocked-shot average (2.7).
- ✓ Junior guard **Naithan George** is second in the ACC in assists with 48 (league games).
- ✓ Freshman guard **Calvin Russell III** was the first Orange football player since **Xavier Gaines** (2002-03) to score in a basketball game with his rebound bucket at NC State.

Notre Dame Notes

- ✓ The Irish are coming off a 100-97, two overtime loss to Virginia on Tuesday.
- ✓ Notre Dame has been without junior guard **Markus Burton**, who was averaging 18.5 points per game after 10 contests before suffering an injury.
- ✓ Freshman guard **Jalen Haralson** has produced 15.0 points per outing.
- ✓ Sophomore guard **Cole Certa** had 34 points and five 3-pointers, versus Virginia.
- ✓ **Braeden Shrewsberry** (11.5 ppg.), a junior guard, had five threes against the Cavaliers.

- ✓ **January 24:** Miami shot 33-of-54 (.611) from the field and built a 37-21 rebound advantage in a 85-76 win against Syracuse.
- ✓ SU had five players in double-digit points, led by **Donnie Freeman** (14) and **Kiyan Anthony** (13) and **Naithan George** (13)
- ✓ **January 21:** Virginia Tech overcame a seven-point, halftime deficit and defeated the Orange, 76-74. The Hokies converted 26-of-36 free throws and outscored Syracuse 26-12 at the charity stripe.

Calvin Russell III, a two-sport standout at Miami Northwestern High School, has joined the Syracuse men's basketball program.

Russell III, a 6-5, 190-pound swingman, who has enrolled for the spring semester at Syracuse, started practice with the team on January 12.

Russell III had committed to the Orange football program. A five-star recruit according to 247Sports, Russell was ranked as the number two wide receiver and number 23 overall player in the Class of 2026.

As a member of the Bulls basketball team, Russell III helped the team reach the regional semifinals of the Florida High School Athletic Association 4A state playoffs in 2024-25.

- ✓ **Dec. 22: Naithan George** had 22 points and **J.J. Starling** added 20 points in a 77-48 win against Stonehill.
- ✓ The Orange used a 16-0, second-half run to pull away from the Skyhawks.
- ✓ **Dec. 20: Naithan George** scored a season-high 22 points, which included a 12-of-14 effort from the free-throw line, and SU defeated Northeastern, 91-83.
- ✓ **Kiyan Anthony** had 18 points off the bench and **Tyler Betsey**, **Nate Kingz** and **William Kyle III** each scored 14.
- ✓ **Dec. 17: William Kyle III** and **J.J. Starling** each had 15 points and SU won the first-ever meeting with Mercyhurst, 76-62.
- ✓ **Kyle III** added 10 rebounds and five blocked shots and **Sadiq White Jr.** contributed 13 points and nine boards versus the Lakers.
- ✓ **Dec. 13:** Hofstra hit 12-of-18 3-pointers and ultimately edged host SU, 70-69.
- ✓ **J.J. Starling** led five SU players who tallied double-digit points with 15. **William Kyle III** had 13 points, six boards and four blocks.
- ✓ **Dec. 11:** Five players scored in double digits and Syracuse held Saint Joseph's to .357 shooting in a 71-63 Orange triumph.
- ✓ **Tyler Betsey** tied his career high with 16 points and William Kyle III had 12 points and 11 rebounds.
- ✓ **Dec. 5:** SU announced that freshman guard **Aaron Womack** plans to redshirt in 2025-26. He remains eligible to practice and suit up for games (but not compete).
- ✓ **Dec. 2: William Kyle III** and **Sadiq White Jr.** converted free throws in the final 11 seconds and SU upended #13 Tennessee, 62-60, in the ACC/SEC Challenge.
- ✓ **Nate Kingz** scored all 19 of his points in the first half and **J.J. Starling** tallied seven of his 12 points in the last seven minutes.



Moten, Syracuse All-Time Scorer, To Be Honored

Syracuse University will honor the legacy of the late Lawrence Moten at the men's basketball game with Notre Dame on Saturday, Jan. 31, at the JMA Wireless Dome.

A ceremony, featuring highlights of Moten's career, and attending by members of his family, will be held in recognition of his many accomplishments in basketball and in the Syracuse community.

Moten, who was known nationally in basketball circles for his moniker "Poetry in Moten," passed away on September 30 at the age of 53.

Moten produced a school-record 2,334 points, a total that has not been approached since, between 1991-95. Moten also established the BIG EAST Conference scoring record (1,405 points), a standard that stood until 2020, some 25 years after he played. the campaign with a 22-10 record.

Moten was selected in the second round of the 1995 NBA Draft by the Vancouver Grizzlies and spent two seasons with Grizzlies. Moten signed with the Washington Wizards in 1998 and then continued to play professionally in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) and the American Basketball Association (ABA) through 2006. He also had stints playing overseas in Spain and Venezuela.

During the 1999-00 season, Moten was one of 25 players honored with placement on the Syracuse All-Century Team.

Syracuse University retired Moten's jersey in a pre-game ceremony on March 3, 2018.

The 2025-26 basketball team is wearing a "21" patch on its game jerseys. The Orange are also wearing "Poetry 21" shooting shirts.

Cohen Named Letterwinner of Distinction

Hal Cohen '80 was named a Letterwinner of Distinction, one of the highest honors that Syracuse Athletics bestows upon former student-athletes and teams. The 60th celebration of the award was held on November 1 at Drumlins Country Club.

Cohen was a four-year letterwinner for the Syracuse men's basketball program. A member of Jim Boeheim's first recruiting class, he helped the Orange reach the NCAA Tournament in four-straight seasons.

The Orange won at least 22 games each year and finished with a 26-4 mark in three of those seasons. Overall, Syracuse was 100-18 with Cohen on the squad.

His contributions and his games played increased in each of his four campaigns with the Orange. As a junior in 1978-79, Cohen saw action in 29 contests, including 21 as a starter. He averaged a career-high 8.1 points and 3.0 assists per game. Cohen played in 30 outings his final year and finished with 108 games played.

Cohen was the fifth Syracuse men's basketball player to earn CoSIDA Academic All-American recognition, earning second-team honors in 1979.

Prior to enrolling at Syracuse, Cohen was a standout performer at Canton Central High School. The Golden Bears won a Section X title and the X-VII intersectional crown during his time. In 2018, he was inducted into the New York State Basketball Hall of Fame.

After receiving his medical degree from SUNY Upstate Medical University, Cohen went on to a successful career as a diagnostic radiology specialist, primarily in Syracuse.



Hackett, Lee To Have Their Jerseys Retired

The jerseys of former basketball standouts Rudy Hackett (#45) and Jim Lee (#10) will join the most significant numbers in Syracuse hoop history when they are retired in a ceremony scheduled for Saturday, February 21, 2025, in the JMA Wireless Dome. The Orange are scheduled to host ACC rival North Carolina that afternoon.

Hackett and Lee were teammates on Syracuse's first NCAA Final Four squad, the 1974-75 group that advanced to the national semifinals in San Diego.

In three varsity seasons at Syracuse, Hackett accumulated 1,496 points and averaged 17.2 points per game. He was the 14th player in school history to surpass 1,000 points and remains tied for 26th on the all-time point list with the Orange. Hackett reached the milestone in 66 contests, a mark that is tied for the 15th fastest at Syracuse. He started 84 of 87 contests he competed in for the Orange.

Hackett was Syracuse's leading rebounder in each of his three seasons and ranks sixth in career rebounds (990) with the Orange. He grabbed 407 boards as a senior (12.7), which was the school record until Derrick Coleman exceeded the total with 422 in 1988-89.

In the 1974-75 season, Hackett scored 709 points, the ninth-best total at Syracuse. His scoring average (22.2 ppg.) remains the eighth highest in a single season with the Orange. Hackett earned 1974-75 All-American recognition from the Associated Press (2nd team) and Basketball Weekly (3rd team).

Lee was also a 1,000-point career scorer at Syracuse, totaling 1,165 points in three years. He ranks 51st on the list of Orange performers who surpassed 1,000 points. Lee led Syracuse in assists in 1973-74 (107) and 1974-75 (115). He started every game of his junior and senior years, a streak of 58 contests.

One of the most successful free-throw shooters in Syracuse history, Lee led the Orange in free-throw percentage in 1972-73 (.885), 1973-74 (.812) and 1974-75 (.812). His career free-throw percentage (.859) ranks fourth at Syracuse.

The Orange made three consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament with Hackett and Lee in the lineup and Coach Roy Danforth at the helm. Syracuse posted campaigns of 24-5 (1972-73), 19-7 (1973-74) and 23-9 (1974-75).

Hackett and Lee were both named to the 25-player Syracuse University All-Century Team that was selected by fan vote during the 1999-2000 season. The duo also own residence in the Upstate New York Basketball Hall of Fame. Hackett starred at Mount Vernon High School and Lee was a product of Windsor High School.

Autry In Second Season As Court Boss

Adrian Autry is in his third year as head coach at his alma mater.

In his first campaign at the helm, Autry guided the Orange to a 20-12 overall record and an 11-9 Atlantic Coast Conference mark.

His second season was marked by injuries to two key starters, J.J. Starling and Donnie Freeman. The Orange finished the year 14-19 overall and 7-13 in the ACC. Autry guided Syracuse to a first-round triumph in the ACC Tournament.

Autry was named head coach at Syracuse following the completion of the 2022-23 season. He was selected to replace his mentor, Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim, who held the post for 47 years.

Autry had returned to his alma mater when he was named an assistant coach prior to the 2011-12 season. In March of 2017, Autry was promoted to associate head coach.

A product of St. Nicholas of Tolentine in the Bronx, Autry was a McDonald's All-American in 1990. He earned first-team All-New York City three times and played on the 1988 New York City and New York State championship squads.

An Orange Star

Autry started 116-of-121 games in four seasons with the Orange, a stretch that began in 1990 and ended in 1994. Autry still ranks fifth in career assists (631) and sixth in career steals (217) at Syracuse. The Orange earned NCAA Tournament invitations in 1990-91, 1991-92 and 1993-94.

He graduated from SU with a degree in Speech Communication in 1994.

Overseas Orange

Autry had a successful professional basketball career, primarily in European leagues. He played for teams in Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Russia, Turkey and Venezuela. Autry also had stints in the United States Basketball League (USBL).

The Quest To Coach

Autry embarked on a coaching career in January 2006 when he was hired as associate head coach at Bishop Ireton Catholic High School (Va.). He became AAU basketball coach with Nova United in April 2006, leading the 14-Under team and then the 15-Under squad. In September 2007, he became assistant basketball coach at Paul VI High School (Va.). He was named an assistant coach on the AAU Triple Threat squad, working with the 17-Under team, in 2008.

He moved into the collegiate ranks in 2008 when he was hired by then-head coach Seth Greenburg as director of basketball operations at Virginia Tech. He was later elevated to an assistant coach post, before moving back to Syracuse.

The Adrian Autry Radio Show begins its third year on Wednesday, November 5th, at 7:00 p.m. It will air live on TK99/105, Cuse.com, the 'Cuse APP and the Varsity Network App from The Wildcat Sports Pub located at 3680 Milton Ave, in Camillus, N.Y.

Autry, in his third year at the helm of his alma mater's basketball program, will join Voice of the Orange Matt Park during each game week to provide insight on the Orange and their upcoming matchup.
