HAVING WON 2 CONSECUTIVE ACC GAMES, SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT NOTRE DAME
With two consecutive wins and three victories in its last four games, Florida State travels to play at Notre Dame on Saturday, February 4, 2026 at 4:00 p.m. at the Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center. The game will be televised on The CW. The Seminoles arrive in the upper Midwest to play their only game of the season in the state of Indiana and their only regular season game against Notre Dame with consecutive victories over Cal (January 28, 63-61) and Stanford (88-80, January 31) on their resume. With three victories in their last four games, the Seminoles have won at Miami (65-63, January 20) and earned victories over Cal and Stanford. Following Saturday's game against Notre Dame, the Seminoles will be tested against both teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia with games against the Cavaliers at home (February 10, 7:00 p.m.) and against the Hokies (February 14, 2:00 p.m.).

LOUCKS AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Florida State head coach Luke Loucks scored five points and added 4 assists in 22 minutes of playing time as No. 10 seeded Florida State defeated No. 4 seeded Notre Dame in the 2011 NCAA Tournament at the United Center in Chicago on March 20, 2011. It's the only game Loucks has played in or coached against the Fighting Irish in his career. The Seminoles upset the fourth-ranked Fighting Irish thanks to a deadly combination of their typical suffocating defense and a hot night shooting from the outside in the victory. Defensively, the Seminoles held Notre Dame to just .306 percent field goal shooting and only .233 shooting from 3-point range.

WINNING WITH DEFENSE AND REBOUNDS

In their three ACC victories over Miami (65-63), Cal (63-61), and most recently Stanford (88-80), the Seminoles have limited their opponents to an average of 68.0 points (11.6 points below Florida State's defensive average for the season) and limited their opponents to a combined .420 field goal shooting percentage (79-188). In each of their victories over the Hurricanes, the Golden Bears, and the Cardinal, the Seminoles have led for at least 18 minutes of each game (18:22 against Miami; 31:04 against Cal; 28:47 against Stanford) and led by at least six points in each game (six against Miami, 15 against Cal, and their ACC season-high of 19 against Stanford).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its third consecutive ACC game. The last time the Seminoles won three or more straight ACC games came against Georgia Tech (82-71, January 23, 2024), Virginia Tech (77-74, January 6, 2024), Wake Forest (87-82, January 9, 2024), at Notre Dame (67-58, January 13, 2024), and Miami (84-75, January 17, 2024) during the 2023-24 season;
...Defeat Notre Dame and win its sixth consecutive game against the Irish. The Seminoles' current five-game winning streak against the Irish began with a 74-70 Florida State victory on March 2, 2022;
...Defeat Notre Dame and win its third consecutive game at the Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center on Notre Dame's campus. The Seminoles' current streak at the Joyce Center began with an 84-71 win over the Irish on January 17, 2023.

Luke Loucks One of three current ACC head coaches - Luke Loucks (Florida State, 2012), Jon Scheyer (Duke, 2009, 2010), and Hubert Davis (North Carolina, 1989, 1991) - who won ACC Basketball Championships at their alma mater. All three are currently coaching at their ACC alma mater.

WHERE FLORIDA STATE'S POINTS ARE COMING FROM

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame averaging 80.8 points scored per game and have totaled 80 or more points in 12 of its 22 games this season. Most recently, the Seminoles scored their ACC season-high of 88 points in their 88-80 win over Stanford on January 31 Tallahassee. The Seminoles are averaging more than 80 points scored per game for the 2017-18 season when they averaged 80.2 points scored per game. Phil Cofer (12.8 ppg), Terance Mann (12.6 ppg), and Braian Angola Rodas (12.5 ppg) led a parade of nine Seminoles who all averaged 6.5 points scored per game as the Seminoles finished with a 23-12 overall record and a 9-9 record in ACC play.

FLORIDA STATE SHOOTS ACC SEASON-HIGH .547 FROM THE FIELD IN WIN OVER STANFORD

Florida State shot its ACC season-high of .547 from the field (29 of 53) in its 88-80 victory over Stanford on January 31. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles have shot 50 percent or better from the field in a game. The Seminoles shot their season-high of .557 and scored 108 points in their season opener against Alcorn State (November 4), shot .594 and scored 87 points against Duke (January 3) and shot .547 and scored 88 points against Stanford (January 31).

SEMINOLES RANK THIRD IN ACC IN STEALS; APPROACHING 200 STEALS FOR THE SEASON

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Notre Dame ranked third in the ACC in steals with 187 and an 8.5 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled seven steals in their victory over Stanford on January 31 and have earned seven or more steals in 15 different games. Florida State totaled its ACC-high of 12 steals against Miami and has earned seven or more steals in four different ACC games.

SEMINOLES LIMITING THEIR TURNOVERS IN ACC GAMES

Florida State is averaging 9.3 turnovers in its last four ACC games as compared to 13.0 turnovers in its first five ACC games of the season. The Seminoles are averaging fewer than 10 turnovers per game in each of their last four games and have won three of their last four games. Florida State is 5-2 when it commits less than 10 turnovers in a game including 2-2 in ACC play with victories over Cal and Stanford. The Seminoles have totaled 45 assists against only 24 turnovers (1.9:1) with single digit turnovers in their last three games (eight at SMU, seven against Cal, nine against Stanford).

SEMINOLES ALSO IMPROVING THEIR RATE OF DEFENDING WITHOUT FOULING

Florida State made 23 of 29 free throws and shot .793 percent from the free throw line in its victory over Stanford. It marked the fifth time this season the Seminoles had made 20 or more free throws with 20 made free throws coming against NC State and 23 in their victory over Stanford. In ACC play, the Seminoles have made 131 free throws (14.6 FTM/Game) as compared to their opponents 118 free throws made (13.1 FTM/Game). Among the biggest differences from the free throw line for Seminoles have come during their last four games (3-1 record) when they have cut their fouls per game average to 15.5 fouls per game and their points allowed from the free throw line to 11.3 points allowed per game. In their first five ACC games (0-5) the Seminoles averaged 17.8 fouls per game while allowing 14.6 points per game from the free throw line. Against Stanford, the Seminoles were whistled for their ACC season-low 12 fouls and sent the Cardinal to the line only nine times where they totaled only six points.

LAST GAME AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Florida State benefited from an 18-0 first half run which turned a 17-7 deficit into a 25-17 lead midway through the first half, and were led in double-figure scoring by Malique Ewin (18 points and 10 rebounds) and Jamir Watkins (21 points) to take a 67-60 win over Notre Dame at the Donald L. Tucker Center on February 4, 2025. Ewin earned his eighth double-double of the season and Watkins scored 20 or more points for the 15th time in his career to lead the Seminoles to the victory. Watkins fueled a crucial second-half run, making three consecutive three-pointers at 17:06, 15:45, and 15:18 marks to catapult the Seminoles to a 43-34 lead. The Fighting Irish clawed back into the game and regained the lead by a 46-45 margin on two free throws by Markus Burton. Florida State quickly regained the lead on a basket by Justin Thomas only to see the Fighting Irish tie the game at 47-47 on one of two free throws by Kebba Njie. Chandler Jackson gave the Seminoles the lead for good on a jumper at the 9:11 mark to give the Seminoles a 49-47 advantage. Florida State outscored Notre Dame, 18-13, during the remainder of the game, never relinquished the lead and won its fourth ACC game at the Tucker Center this season.

.429 Senior Kobe MaGee is shooting .429 from the 3-point line (three of seven) in the last two games.

.722 Freshman Thomas Bassong is shooting .722 from the free throw line (13 of 18) in the last seven games. He made four free throws and scored his career-high of 14 points against NC State (January 10).

.783 Senior Robert McCray is shooting .783 from the free throw line (18 of 23) in his last six games. He was a perfect five of five from the free throw line and 12 points against Wake Forest and made six free throws each in victories over Miami (January 20) and Stanford (January 31).

.789 Senior Lajae Jones is shooting .789 from the free throw line (15 of 19) in the last three games. He made eight of nine free throws and scored 18 points in Florida State's victory over Stanford (January 31).

.800 Senior Alex Steen is shooting .800 from the field (12 of 15) in the last three games. He was a perfect five of five from the field and scored 12 points against Stanford (January 31).

.889 Senior Chauncey Wiggins is shooting .889 from the free throw line in the last two games. He was a near-perfect seven of eight (.875) from the free throw line and scored his career-high of 23 points in Florida State's victory over Stanford (January 31).

Senior Chauncey Wiggins averaged 20.5 points (41 total points) and 4.0 rebounds (eight total rebounds) while shooting .542 from the field (13 of 24) and .889 from the free throw line (eight of nine) in Florida State's victories over Cal (18 points on seven of nine shooting from the field) and Stanford (23 points on seven of eight shooting from the free throw line).

Thomas Bassong: Florida State's Two-Way Threat

TALLAHASSEE – While Florida State freshman Thomas Bassong was playing for his home country of France in the FIBA U19 World Cup in Switzerland earlier this summer, a familiar face walked into the Vaudois Arena in Lausanne just before France tipped off against Cameroon in their first of seven games in the championship.

The visitor was none other than first year Seminole head coach Luke Loucks, who was there to watch one of the four true freshmen on his first Florida State roster compete against high-level players in the world championship tournament.

Bassong was well aware that Loucks had traveled 12 hours to see him in action, but the sight of his future coach in the crowd watching his France team in a 75-50 win against Cameroon filled him with joy.

"I was very happy because it showed the love Coach Loucks has for his players," said Bassong on the day he attended his first fall semester class at Florida State in August. "I knew then that I had made the right choice about which college to attend in the United States. I knew Coach Loucks was coming because we were texting each other before the tournament began, but it was a great feeling when our eyes met."

Bassong, who played high school basketball at the nationally renowned Our Saviour Lutheran School in New York City while also playing For the Jelly Fam squad in Overtime Elite, has long dreamed about playing college basketball in the United States.

He was born in Paris and lived in the City of Light until he was 16. It was then that he and his family realized he had a future playing the game of basketball. In hopes of furthering his basketball career, Bassong moved to the north of France, then to Lithuania where he played in one of the best youth programs in Europe. He continued his schooling as a senior in high school during the 2024-25 academic year in New York.

It was the move to New York, according to Bassong, that led him to Florida State University and the opportunity to live his life-long dream of earning a degree and playing basketball at a top institution in the United States.

"I've always tried to find a way to play at the best level of basketball," said Bassong. "When I knew that I could come to the States to play and study at a such great university like Florida State, it was a blessing for me and my family."

His family has always been the foundation of Bassong's values, and they played a pivotal role in his decision to pick up a basketball at age 10.

Before that, he was a standout on the tennis court, often rallying with his twin brother, Thibault, and his father, Bruno.

When he was 10, his father sadly passed.

"My dad, my brother and I used to play tennis together," said Bassong. "When my dad died, playing tennis didn't make sense to me anymore. I felt empty, and began playing basketball with some of the guys from my class. From there I joined their team."

Surrounded by his mother, a high school math teacher in France, his brother, and two older cousins, Bassong quickly began to thrive on the basketball court. He improved quickly and became a power player in France's national program.

His first experience within the French National program was at the 2024 Adidas Next Generation Tournament. The Next Generation tournament is a competition matching the best basketball clubs in Europe.

Bassong's basketball career is less than 10 years old, but he has developed into a versatile, two-way player.

"I would say I'm a two-way player," said Bassong. "I feel like I can defend really well while also having the ability to score very well, too. The best part of my game is my versatility on offense because I feel like I can score the basketball in so many ways. My best part on the defensive side is the fact that I can guard most of the positions on the court."

"I love to defend. It's a challenge to me to show that I have a strong desire to play defense when I am on the court."

At 6-foot-8 with a 7-foot-3 wingspan, Bassong has the body type that fits in perfectly well with Loucks' coaching philosophy.

"We are really excited about having Thomas on our roster because of his versatility," said Loucks. "Thomas is the type of player we want to help build our program as we move forward. He has the body-type, work ethic, and skills on both ends of the court that are going to help him earn playing time."

"His jump shot is still developing, but he's a slasher who can put it on the ground and get to the rim. He has a great amount of confidence and an athletic ability that lets him get anywhere on the floor at any time."

Now that he has settled in to life as a college student at Florida State, Bassong has set his sights squarely on the Seminoles' season-opener at the Donald L. Tucker Center on November 4.

"The best part about being a member of this program is how welcoming the coaching staff, my teammates, the students and faculty have been," said Bassong. "The program Coach Loucks and his staff are building is a huge family that immediately made me feel like I was at the right place. The unique culture of Florida State is so amazing to me. I'm very happy to be here."

The connection to his coaches and teammates also helps when you have a coach who will fly halfway around the world to watch you play.

It's a French term referring to a relentlessly hard-working player and it's a perfect two-word description for Florida State's Thomas (Toh-Ma) Bassong.

With his career-high of 14 points to go along with two steals in 21 minutes of playing time against NC State on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center, Bassong is quickly gaining the reputation as one of the Seminoles' hardest working players.

The Paris, France native will help lead the Seminoles into one of the toughest environments in college basketball (the JMA Wireless Dome) against one of the traditional powerhouses in college basketball (Syracuse).

"I take pride in doing the gritty work," said Bassong. "Doing the little things that give an energy boost to the team and to myself are very important. When I play hard and do the gritty work it doesn't really matter to me how many points or stats I put up. I just know that I have done my best."

Bassong's best efforts have come recently as the Seminoles have begun ACC play. Another test awaits the Seminoles as they face an Orange team that is ranked among the ACC leaders in blocked shots (first, 6.7 bpg), scoring defense (second, 65.7 points allowed per game), and field goal percentage defense (defense, .399).

Bassong led Florida State with 14 points against NC State on Saturday in Tallahassee. It marked the first time he has led the Seminoles in scoring and marked the second time a freshman has led Florida State in scoring this season. Bassong became the first Seminole to lead the team in scoring in an ACC game since Daquan Davis totaled 18 against Syracuse on January 4, 2025.

He has scored in double-figures in three of his last five games (37 total points) and is averaging 7.4 points scored per game since scoring 10 points in consecutive games against Mississippi Valley State (December 19) and Jacksonville (December 22). During that stretch of games, he shot .650 from the field (13 of 20) and made his Florida State high of five field goals against NC State.

Florida State's head coach Luke Loucks has certainly noticed Bassong's effort and improvement since his arrival in Tallahassee in early August after playing for his home country of France in FIBA U-19 World Cup in Switzerland during the summer of 2025.

"A lone bright spot to me was Thomas Bassong tonight," said Loucks following the Seminoles' game against NC State. "We were already planning on playing him a little more; he's had some really good practices. Thomas had the right energy and the most consistent spirit in terms of wanting to be there and wanting to play in the basketball game today."

One area where Bassong's hard work has provided results has been from the free throw line.

In scoring his career-high of 14 points against the Wolfpack, Bassong has now made more free throws in his last four games than he did in the first 12 games of his Florida State career. Bassong has made nine of his last 12 free throws in his last four games and has made at least one free throw in nine of the first 16 games of his career.

He made four free throws and scored 10 points in Florida State's victory over Jacksonville (December 22) and made four of five attempts in reaching his career-high for points scored against NC State.

Bassong has also seen an increase in his points per game average.

Bassong has scored in double figures three times in the last five games after not reaching double figures in scoring in any of his first 11 games. His previous career-high for scoring was eight points in the first two games of his career against Alcorn State and Alabama State. Bassong scored 10 points in Florida State's back-to-back victories over Mississippi Valley State and Jacksonville.

"My feel and understanding for the game have grown the most for me," said Bassong. "I'm feeling way more comfortable now. I know when to attack and when to pass."

Loucks and his coaching staff have watched the beginning of Bassong's maturation process since his arrival.

"There's going to be some growing pains for Thomas as well as Cam (Miles)," said Loucks. "Those two guys are freshmen who are playing real minutes in the ACC. Other teams that we are going against have McDonald's All-Americans that are playing less than our two freshmen. We are going to have to live with some growing pains."

While Bassong continues to find his way at Florida State and in the ACC, Loucks will continue to believe in his first-year forward.

"The biggest thing that Thomas brings to the table is that he plays with a ton of energy," said Loucks. "Sometimes that leads to mistakes. As long as he is playing with great energy, we've got to work through some of those mistakes as a freshman, hoping that as he develops those mistakes become less and less."

"Thomas gets on the court and is going to give you everything that he has. He's going to be an unbelievable player. He's about the right things, he's coachable, he'll look you in the eye when he makes a mistake. He's just getting to the point where he is starting to understand the game which can be scary. With his energy and body type, when he starts to understand basketball, he's going to be a very good player for a long time."

As Bassong continues to learn the game of basketball under the tutelage of the Florida State coaching staff he is looking for a long-term education both in the classroom and the basketball court.

"I want to be one of those players that starts the legacy of Florida State," said Bassong. "When fans are talking about the ACC, they automatically think about North Carolina and Duke. When I'll graduate or go the league, I want people talk about Florida State. I want to be part of that and to be a leader of this new era."

And as Bassong carves out his place at Florida State, he does it the only way he knows: avec une grit acharnée, en construisant sa legacy jour après jour.

TALLAHASSEE — Senior Robert McCray V was credited with a school-record 17 assists, and Luke Loucks won his first game as the Seminoles' head coach in a 108-76 season-opening win for the Seminoles over Alcorn State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. McCray broke the school record for assists in a single game, formerly held by Otto Petty in 1972 and matched by Tony William in 1983. With 12 points to go along with his 17 assists, McCray became the first player to record a double-double in a season-opener since Malik Osborn totaled a double-double of 18 points and 13 rebounds against Penn on Nov. 10, 2021. Loucks earned his first victory as Florida State's head coach as he became the eighth Seminole coach to win his first game. Every coach in school history has now won his first game as Florida State's head coach. McCray V also was the first player to record at least 13 assists since Loucks recorded 13 against North Carolina in leading the Seminoles to the first ACC Championship in school history on March 11, 2012.
